Dear Francis,

Your very welcome, newsy letter just arrived. I'll write you a more thorough answer after I talk with Dave at Chicago. Meanwhile, I wonder if you could "brief" him on some things you mentioned in your letter which were just ~~more~~ informative ~~enough~~ enough to be tantalizing:

- a. "inheritance" of asparagine adaptation. Are you finally doing crosses with coli? My observations were simply that a loopful inoculum came up as quickly on a glucose-malate medium as it did on a glucose-asparagine medium. No further investigation here planned.

- c. If Nelson's paper has any data in it, could I have a look at it. Perhaps Perk would take it with him and I could look at it in Chi.
