PART I. HISTORICAL INFORMATION

"Green Hill" plantation was built by Samuel Pannill who first bought 600 acres from William and Moses Fuqua in 1797, and added to and developed the plantation 'til his death in 1864.

PART II. ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

These walks and drives are in their original state of construction. The paving consists of field stone of various sizes set between a stone curbing laid in mortar about 6' in width. The walks and drives form an all weather connection between every building in the "Upper Town" area.

The condition of these are in remarkably good condition despite constant use by modern machinery.

The cobblestone paving forms part of the strong axial system that characterizes the grouping of the buildings comprising the "Upper Town" area. The photograph shows a section of the drive south of the main house just east of the log barn. Other portions of walkways and drives can be seen throughout the area although grass and soil has covered most of them. Extent of construction is unknown.
