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Thailand Grain and Feed Weekly Rice Price Update 2007

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Report Highlights:

Despite a continued weakening Thai bath, export prices were offered \$1-2/MT higher due to an increase in domestic prices as exporters are fulfilling outstanding shipments to Iran, Iraq, and African countries.

Market Tone

Despite a continued weakening Thai baht (up to 34 baht/\$U.S. this week compared 33.7 baht/\$U.S. last week), export price were offered higher by \$1-2/MT. The increase reflected continued surge in domestic prices of white rice, particularly in premium white rice, which increased 2 percent from the previous week. Exporters are aggressively buying premium white rice to fill contracted shipments to Iran under Government-to-Government deals. In addition, exporters are securing 5% grade white rice for private shipments to Iraq. Meanwhile, domestic prices of broken white rice also increased significantly. Exporters are working to fill pending shipments to African countries. Broken white rice prices will likely remain at high levels until the end of the year due to limited exportable supplies of major competitors like Vietnam.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. The authority to report fragrant rice exports was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.

Unofficial exports (excluding fragrant rice) for Aug. 6-12, 2007 totaled 100,989 tons, up 16,887 tons from the previous week's total, and up 6,989 tons from the four-week moving average of 94,000 tons. Export during Jan. 1 – Aug. 12, 2007 totaled 3,180,154 tons, as compared with 2,913,246 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during Jan. 1 – Jul. 31, 2007, amounted to 4,689,778 tons, up 9.8 percent from 4,269,485 tons in the previous year.
