The Numbers Game -- How Many Detainees? SUBJECT:

Col. San Roman of the Interior Ministry told Bill Hallman and myself today that there are now 1453 people under PEN. In addition, there are approximately 1100 persons who have completed the judicial process and are now serving their prison terms. San Roman estimated that there are also 300-400 people who are undergoing civil or military judicial process but who are not under PEN. In sum by San Roman's estimates-and he is probably reporting accurately and has access to the information, there are now about 2,900-3,000 people detained for other than criminal charges. San Roman said in 1976 this same figure was about 8,500.

He attributed much of this improvement to the regulations issued by the President in April, stating that these regulations give standards against which the authorities' performance is measured by both the prisoners When treatment falls below the level of The regulations complaints can and are made and the conditions usually corrected.
