**RE: Echostar / Direct TV Merger**

Dear Mr. Powell:

The EchoStar / Direct TV merger pending before the F.C.C. and the D.O.J. will provide many benefits to most Americans. The new company, EchoStar, will be a good competitor to cable companies, which today control 80% of the pay television households in the United States. Too, with the increase in competition from the improved EchoStar, cable companies would be motivated to improve their own services at a lower cost.

Satellite space is limited and the EchoStar / Direct TV merger will free up more satellite spectrum space because duplicative programs will be eliminated. EchoStar, would be able to offer significantly more educational, specialty, and foreign language programming than it could before. 
