POULTRY SLAUGHTER

The Preliminary total live weight of poultry inspected during October 2008 was 5.22 billion pounds, down 3 percent from 5.38 billion pounds a year ago. Young chickens inspected totaled 4.40 billion pounds, down 3 percent from October 2007.

Mature chickens, at 80.5 million pounds, were up 7 percent from the previous year. Young chickens slaughtered during October 2008 averaged 5.65 pounds per bird, up 1 percent from October 2007.

CHICKEN AND EGG PRODUCTION

SOUTH CAROLINA'S laving flocks produced 92 million eggs during October, down 11 percent from last vear. Production totaled 69 million table eggs and 23 million hatching eggs. The number of layers averaged 4,367,000 birds, down 7 percent from 4,697,000 a year ago. October egg production per 100 layers was 2,107 eggs, compared with 2,193 in 2007.

UNITED STATES egg production totaled 7.61 billion during October 2008, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.54 billion table eggs, and 1.08 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.01 billion were broiler-type and 69 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during October 2008 averaged 335 million, down 2 percent from last year. October egg production per 100 layers was 2,276 eggs, up 1 percent from October 2007.

BROILER HATCHERY PRODUCTION

During the month of October, SOUTH CAROLINA'S broiler hatcheries produced 19.0 million chicks, down 4 percent from last year's 19.9 million chicks.

THE UNITED STATES broiler-type chicks hatched during October 2008 totaled 742 million, down 7 percent from October 2007. Eggs in incubators totaled 585 million on November 1, 2008, down 7 percent from October 2007.

OCTOBER DAIRY PRODUCTION

Total cheese output (excluding cottage cheese) was 842 million pounds, 2.0 percent above October 2007 and 5.8 percent above September 2008.

Italian type cheese production totaled 343 million pounds, 1.4 percent below October 2007 but 2.8 percent above September 2008.

American type cheese production totaled 342 million pounds, 6.5 percent above October 2007 and 7.9 percent above September 2008.


Butter production was 130 million pounds, slightly below October 2007 but 7.4 percent above September 2008.

Dry Milk Powders: (comparisons with October 2007) Nonfat dry milk, human -- 121 million pounds, up 21.1 percent. Skim milk powders -- 17.6 million pounds, down 18.1 percent.

Whey products: (comparisons with October 2007) Dry whey, total -- 85.2 million pounds, down 4.2 percent. Lactose, human and animal -- 60.2 million pounds, down 2.2 percent. Whey protein concentrate, total -- 36.7 million pounds, up 13.8 percent.

Frozen products: (comparisons with October 2007) Ice cream, Regular (hard) -- 69.2 million gallons, down 1.2 percent. Ice cream, Lowfat (total) -- 27.4 million gallons, down 6.5 percent. Sherbet (hard) -- 4.18 million gallons, up 1 percent. Frozen Yogurt (total) -- 4.48 million gallons, up 1.7 percent.







COTTON GINNINGS

Based on the December 1 Cotton Ginning Survey, SOUTH CAROLINA'S COTTON production is expected to total 260,000 bales. This is up 20,000 bales from last month, and up 100,000 bales from 2007. Acres for harvest, at 139,000, is down 24,000 acres from 2007. This year's expected average yield per acre of 931 pounds is up 71 pounds from last month, and up 445 pounds from 2007. All cotton production in the UNITED STATES is forecast at 13.6 million 480-pound bales, up 1 percent from last month but down 29 percent from last year's 19.2 million bales. Yield is expected to average 843 pounds per harvested acre, up 6 pounds from last month, but down 36 pounds from 2007. Harvested area of all cotton is expected to total 7.8 million acres, unchanged from last month but down 26 percent from last year.

PEANUT STOCKS

Peanut stocks reported in commercial storage on October 31, 2008 totaled 3.16 billion pounds of equivalent farmer stock, compared with 2.75 billion pounds last year. This total includes 2.63 billion pounds of actual farmer stock. Shelled peanuts on hand totaled 484 million pounds of farmer stock equivalent. Roasting stock totaled 38.4 million pounds. Shelled peanut stocks totaled 364 million pounds of which 339 million pounds were edible grades and 25.0 million pounds were oil stock. Edible grade stocks by type included 69.5 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 241 million pounds of Runners, and 29.0 million pounds of Spanish. October millings totaled 412 million pounds. Millings by type were 71.0 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 337 million pounds of Runners, and 3.99 million pounds of Spanish.
