### INFORMATION CONCERNING THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION

The Immigration and Nationality Act requires that all immigrant visa applicants and certain nonimmigrant visa applicants, regardless of age, undergo a medical examination before receiving a visa. All applicants must undergo a medical examination administered by one of the following designated doctors before the visa interview. As examinations expire after a period of time, applicants are recommended to schedule their medical examinations no more than 4 weeks prior to the date of the visa interview. Reports generally take approximately one week to prepare. Please bring the unopened results to your visa interview. Please do NOT open your results.

***Be sure to take the following items with you to the medical examination:***

- 1) Visa interview appointment letter
- 2) All family members named in the visa interview appointment letter
- 3) The travel document of each person who will undergo a medical examination
- 4) This instruction sheet
- 5) Three passport-size photographs of each person to be medically examined
- 6) Sufficient money to pay the required fees. See the fee schedule at the end of this document for specific costs.

NOTE: The examining physician may, at his discretion, require additional X-rays or tests to accurately evaluate your medical condition(s). The applicant is responsible for payment of these costs, which will be in addition to those for the basic examination. All medical fees related to the examination are to be paid at the doctor's office. Children under 15 normally are not required to undergo an X-ray. However, the examining physician reserves the right to request such a test if it is deemed necessary.

- 7) If you have a history of tuberculosis, be prepared to present all old X-rays and medical reports.
- 8) If you are receiving or have received medical treatment, please be prepared to present your medical records, test results, and the dosage of any medication you are current taking.
- 9) Please also remember to bring any prescription eyeglasses and/or hearing aids to the appointment.



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### WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION

The medical examination is conducted by one of the appointed panel physicians. It consists of a physical examination (eyes, ears, nose, throat, extremities, heart, lungs, abdomen, lymph nodes, skin and external genitalia), chest X-ray and a blood test, which includes testing for HIV infection and venereal disease. Children between aged 2 and 14 are subject to tuberculin skin test. The blood test and X-ray are generally not required of persons under the age of 15, but they are required, under existing United States law, of all other persons. A blood test for the antibody to the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) is required as part of your medical examination. HIV is the virus that causes the acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS.) Infection with HIV causes a defect in a person's natural immunity against disease. The test is not to diagnose AIDS but to detect antibodies to the virus. Also, it may be necessary to report results to the local health authorities.

### VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR IV APPLICANTS

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE TO IMMIGRANT VISA APPLICANTS CONCERNING VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

United States immigration law requires immigrant visa applicants to obtain certain vaccinations (listed below) prior to the issuance of a visa. Panel physicians who conduct medical examinations of visa applicants are now required to verify that immigrant visa applicants have met the new vaccination requirements, or that it is medically inappropriate for the visa applicant to receive one or more of the following vaccinations: **Acellular pertussis, Haemophilus Influenza type b (Hib), Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Human papillomavirus (HPV), Influenza, , Measles and Mumps and Rubella, Meningococcal, Pneumococcal, Polio, Rotavirus, Tetanus and diphtheria toxoids, Varicella, and Zoster**

To assist the panel physician and to avoid delays in the processing of your visa, **all immigrant visa applicants** should have their vaccination records available for the panel physician's review at the time of the medical examination. Visa applicants should consult with their regular health care provider to obtain a copy of their immunization record, if one is available. If you do not have a vaccination record, the panel physician will work with you to determine which vaccinations you may need to meet the requirement.

**Only a physician can determine which of the listed vaccinations are medically appropriate for you, given your age, medical history and current medical condition.** For more detailed information, please visit the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Panel Physician Technical Instructions for Vaccination.](#)
