Private Sector Financing from the International Finance Corporation (IFC)

In 2002, The IFC invested \$3.6 billion in 206 projects in developing countries around the world. The IFC partners with a range of coinvestors, including private sector corporations, commercial banks, institutional investors, and export credit agencies such as the U.S. Export Import Bank and the U.S. Overseas Private Investment Corporation. The United States is a shareholder nation of the World Bank Group, and as such, American companies can take advantage of the financing services of the IFC. The mission of the IFC is to promote sustainable private sector investment in developing countries to reduce poverty and improve people's lives. The IFC is the largest provider of loans and equity in the emerging markets with an emphasis on achieving sustainability for its investments. Projects must comply with social and environmental standards and provide long-standing benefits.

<u>Eligible Investments:</u> IFC projects range across many industry sectors, including financial services; infrastructure, including communication technologies, power, water and sewerage, and transportation; oil, gas and mining; food and agribusiness; social services, including private health care and education; chemicals and petrochemicals; and hotels and tourism. To receive funding, private sector sponsors must present business plans and be prepared to invest their own capital. Projects must be technically and financially viable, economically competitive, beneficial to the local population, and environmentally and socially sound.

<u>Products and Services</u>: The IFC provides long-term finance products, including loans in circumstances where project sponsors or other financiers are not prepared to take risks alone. Products and services include Loans and financial intermediation services, equity and quasi-equity, guarantees, syndicated loans, underwriting services, private placements, equity funds as well as risk management products.

Guidance on Completing the Shipper's Export Declaration (SED) Is Just a Click Away!

The Shipper's Export Declaration (SED) is a U.S. Government form (7525-V) used by the U.S. Census Bureau to compile trade statistics and to help prevent illegal exports. The Census Bureau has an online tutorial "Correct Way to Complete the Shipper's Export Declaration Form 7525-V", designed to address issues such as "when is an SED required or not required", "how long should I retain shipping documents", as well as a step-by-step explantion of each of the SED's 31 sections and how to complete them.

Here are some quick facts on the SED to get you started:

- The SED must be filled out for any shipment valued at \$2,500 or above (If the shipment is valued at over \$2,500 but is made up of various commodities falling under several Schedule B numbers none of which is valued at \$2,500 or higher, no SED is required.)
- The SED is required for any shipment to particular countries, such as Cuba, Libya, and North Korea, and for any shipment requiring a validated export license.
- An SED is required for shipments to Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and the former Pacific Trust Territories even though they are not considered exports (unless each Schedule B item is under \$2,500).
- Shipments to Canada do not require an SED. (Shipments to third countries passing through Canada do need an SED.)
