## NOTICE OF PROCEEDING TERMINATION

On May 4, 1995, the Commission released an order in the above-referenced proceeding granting NYNEX a waiver to deaverage the transport interconnection charge (TIC) and recover the carrier common line (CCL) charge on a per-line, rather than a per-minute, basis. AT&T and Teleport filed petitions for reconsideration of this order on June 5, 1995. On October 16, 2003, AT&T filed a request to withdraw both its reconsideration petition and that of Teleport. Based on its request to withdraw, AT&T's reconsideration petitions are dismissed without prejudice. It appears that there are no pending petitions for reconsideration or applications for review in this proceeding. At this time, Verizon (formerly NYNEX) no longer charges the TIC or the CCL charge at issue in the proceeding, thus the substantive issues in this proceeding are moot. Therefore, the proceeding will be terminated effective 30 days after publication of this Public Notice in the Federal Register, unless the Wireline Competition Bureau receives an opposition to the termination before that date.

Parties filing oppositions to the termination of this proceeding must file an original and four copies of each filing. The filings should reference the DA number of this Public Notice, **DA 03-3391**. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). The Commission's contractor, Natek, Inc., will receive hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary at 236 Massachusetts Avenue, N.E., Suite 110, Washington, D.C. 20002.
