Mr. George Slad's comments to the Docket concerned Amateurs operating high speed, heavy weight remote piloted vehicles using equipment designed to operate in the Amateur Radio Service (ARS). He opposed allowing Spread Spectrum to be an authorized mode in the 6 metre radio control band.

I think he is correct, and that the band should be removed from the ARS and moved to the rules specified under Part 95 Subpart C.

The interference from AM, FM, and Spread Spectrum data, voice, and image modes to these frequencies could cause loss of life, or damage to property, and these frequencies should be restricted to radio control only, and the equipment should be type accepted and require a permit from Homeland Security to further increase safety to the public.
