<u>PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY</u> Changes to 2007 commercial trip limits for sablefish

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial sablefish trip limits for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, effective at 0001 hours (local time) **December 4, 2007**.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their November 5-9, 2007, meeting in San Diego, CA. Changes to management measures will publish in the *Federal Register* and become effective December 4, 2007. This notice announces changes to sablefish trip limits in the commercial limited entry trawl fishery coastwide and the open access sablefish daily trip limit (DTL) fishery south of 40°10' N. lat. No revisions were made to previously scheduled management measures for the commercial limited entry fixed gear fishery or for recreational fisheries.

Limited Entry Trawl Sablefish Trip Limits

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

As of December 4, 2007, the following trip limit increases are in effect and are provided in Table 3 (North and South,) which is included at the end of this notice:

- North of 40°10' N. lat., increase sablefish trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 30,000 lb per 2 months from November through December; and
- South of 40°10' N. lat., increase sablefish trip limits to 30,000 lb per 2 months from November through December.

Open Access Sablefish DTL Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the open access fishery, see § 660.383 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

As of December 4, 2007, the following trip limit increases are in effect and are provided in Table 5 (South,) which is included at the end of this notice:

• Between 40°10' N. lat. and 36° N. lat., increase sablefish daily trip limits to 300 lb per day, or 1 landing per week of up to 1,000 lb, not to exceed 3,000 lb per 2 months from November through December.

Trip limit tables, effective December 4, 2007, are included at the end of this public notice.
