Geographic Focus of the USAID/Colombia Program for the period 2006 - 2008

USAID/Colombia has worked exhaustively with the Colombian Government, its partners, outside consultants and all other relevant stakeholders to select the regions and municipalities in which to focus our program during the 2006-2008 period. Such selection seeks to focus the bulk of USAID/Colombia activities in areas of the country that: 1) currently are under coca/poppy cultivation or that are vulnerable to illicit crop production; 2) have significant economic potential; 3) have sufficient local and national political will; and 4) have a high incidence of conflict. The Mission believes that its programs in alternative development, democracy and humanitarian assistance can and will be sustainable if activities are more heavily focused in areas of the country with these characteristics. The following is a summary of the regions selected and conclusions that were reached:

- USAID will focus its assistance in the following six regions:
 - 1) Southwest Colombia; includes the departments of Nariño, Cauca, and Valle del Cauca;
 - 2) Macizo/Putumayo; includes northern Putumayo, and the entire departments of Huila and Tolima;
 - 3) **Magdalena Medio/Norte de Santander;** includes portions of Santander, Sur de Bolívar, Sur del Cesar, and all of Norte de Santander;
 - 4) **Uraba/Northwestern Antioquia/Chocó;** includes the Bajo Cauca sub-region, most of Uraba, Cordoba, portions of Choc6 and northwestern Antioquia.
 - 5) **Eje Cafetero;** includes Southern Antioquia and the departments of Risaralda, Quindío, and Caldas; and
 - 6) **Atlantic Coast/Sierra Nevada;** includes Northern Bolivar, all or most of Atlántico and Magdalena, and parts of northwestern Cesar and La Guajira.
- Illustratively, a total of 81 municipalities were approved for ADAM (*Areas de Desarrollo Alternativo Municipal*), MIDAS (*Más Inversión para el Desarrollo Alternativo Sostenible*), Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), and coffee activities in the first four regions listed above. (See attached list).
- For the remaining two regions (5 & 6 above), only MIDAS activities, and, where applicable, coffee, will be supported.
- All program activities will be closely coordinated as a means of maximizing individual and overall program impact and sustainability.
- Adjustments may be made to the municipalities targeted for assistance during program implementation.
