PER CURIAM:

Steven Wayne Goodman appeals the district court's order granting summary judgment to defendants and denying Goodman's Fed. R. Civ. P. 56(f) motion for a discovery continuance. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. <u>See Goodman v. Smith</u>, No. CA-00-986-7 (W.D.
