## "Investing in Treatment: Policymakers' Positive Impact on Their Community" Premieres Wednesday, September 5, 2007

A California study has shown that treatment has a benefit-to-cost ratio of 7:1, meaning that the cost to taxpaying citizens of treating approximately 150,000 people is \$209 million, while the benefits from that treatment are worth about \$1.5 billion in taxpayer savings (Ettner S, et al. Benefit-Cost in the California Treatment Outcome Project: Does Substance Abuse Treatment Pay for Itself? Health Services Research, 41(1):192–213, 2006). As leaders who can influence and shape policy, civic and elected officials play a crucial role in reducing the toll addiction takes on their communities. Implementing policies that effectively treat substance abuse and dependence leads to increased productivity and profitability in the workplace, as well as decreased costs throughout the criminal justice system and social services system. Therefore, policy implementation lessens the financial burden on taxpayers.
