Saturday, December 27 - Walk: Where's the Beach?! - 1:30 PM, 45 minutes, 1 mile. Free. Join a ranger at Coast Guard Beach to learn about Cape Cod's famous sandy beaches and how they change through the seasons. Dress for the weather and be prepared to do some digging in the sand! Meet in the Coast Guard Beach parking area, Eastham.

Sunday, December 28 - Talk: Songs of the Humpback - 1:30 PM, 30 minutes. Free. Known for their alluring songs and acrobatics, humpback whales have been a fascination for centuries. Join a ranger for a talk and activities that highlight the awesome nature of these endearing animals. Takes place inside at Salt Pond Visitor Center, Eastham.

Monday, December 29 - Activity: Brrr! Animals in Winter - 1:30 PM, 1¹/₂ hours, ¹/₂ mile (if weather permits). Free. Did you ever wonder what the fish, snails, and horse-shoe crabs of Salt Pond do in the winter? How about the squirrels, great blue

herons, and bats? Join a ranger to play games and hands-on activities that will help you learn about animal survival in winter. If the weather is nice, we may also venture outside to look for signs of animal activity, so dress warmly! Meet at Salt Pond Visitor Center, Eastham.

Tuesday, December 30 - Walk: Life on the Edge - 10:30 AM, 1 hour, 1 mile. Free. Witness the impact the sea has on the shore and the species that live there. Explore the beach below the bluff. Meet at Nauset Light Beach parking area in Eastham, and discuss the issues associated with an ever-changing shoreline.

Wednesday, December 31 - Talk: Where the Spark of Magic Happened - 10:30 AM, 45 minutes. Free. Hear the story of Guglielmo Marconi and his historic world-changing moment atop a cliff in Wellfleet on a January evening in 1903. Includes the short film, "Voice of Cape Cod." Meet at Salt Pond Visitor Center, Eastham. &

Friday, January 2 - Activity: Animals Do the Grossest Things! - 1:30 PM, 1 hour. Free. Survival is the name of the game in the animal world. 


This message began the first major rescue at sea accomplished by means of wireless communication! In 1909 CQD was the Marconi signal used to call all ships in an emergency. MKC were the letters for the steamship

Steamship Republic

Republic, which was rammed by the *Florida* in dense fog south of Nantucket on January 23, 1909, 100 years ago.

Jack Binns, the Marconi operator on board the *Republic*, stayed at his key as his ship was sinking. He became know as CQD Binns, the first hero of wireless as all 1600 passengers and hands were saved.



Dr. Virginia Utermohlen Lovelace, Jack Binn's grandaughter will present a program about this true traumatic story and how important lessons were lost, not learned, as the *Republic* was hailed as an unsinkable ship, owned by the same company as the *Titanic*, which sinks three years later.

January 18 " 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea" - This adaptation of the classic Jules Verne underwater adventure chronicles Nemo's heroic rescue of shipwrecked survivors and their epic journey "20,000 leagues" beneath the waters of the earth.

January 25 "*A Night to Remember*" - This film has stood the test of time as one of the most accurate portrayals of the *Titanic's* final hours when it struck an iceberg in the North Atlantic on April 14, 1912.

February 1 "Treasure Island" - Robert Louis Stevenson's ageless adventure yarn of buccaneers and buried gold is brought to life in this sumptuous Disney production. A swashbuckling classic fit for all ages.

February 8 "Cast Away" - After a plane crashes in the Pacific Ocean, a sole surviver fights for his life on a deserted island with nothing but a painted volleyball for a companion. "Cast Away" is a fascinating abstract about the human spirit.

February 15 "Master and Commander" - This dramatic thriller pits the captain of the *HMS Surprise* and his crew against a privateer equipped with better weapons during the Napoleonic Wars.
