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ļ	PAULINE ESTEVES: P.O. Box ***, Death
5	Valley, California 92***. I'm here as a cultural
6	advisor for the Timbisha Shoshone tribe. I'm the
7	tribal historic preservation officer located at
8	Furnace Creek in our village at the Indian village in
9	Death Valley.
10	What really brought me over here was that
11	the Timbisha Shoshone tribe isn't referenced in the
12	Federal Register. Walker River Reservation is
13	referenced in the Register, but not the Timbisha
14	Shoshone tribe. And I say this because the two
15	corridors that have been, you know, proposed is going
16	to be in definite impact on our tribal lands right
17	there in Sarcobatus Flats, which is around Scottish
18	Junction. That whole valley there will be impacted
19	and the surrounding areas.
20	And we, as Shoshone people, we have the
21	responsibility to protect all forms of life and also
22	the air, and our spirituality and our religion will
23	be impacted for sure, because it will impact the
24	whole environment, the whole ecosystem and will
25	and this new lands that we have there, it's rather

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- 1 very sad that we have not even developed our lands
- 2 yet and then yet this railway is going to go through
- 3 there, their proposal anyway.
- 4 And so I was saddened though, very disturbed
- 5 by the fact that the Timbisha Shoshone tribe was not

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- 6 even referred to in the Federal Register. Walker
- 7 River was simply because they have that railway going
- 8 through their reservation. But the same applies to
- 9 us, the impact will be there. And it will be there
- 10 very strong.

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- 11 I have done a little study on its structure,
- 12 the railroad, what it takes, and the impacts it's
- 13 going to have on the land and the air and even our
- 14 water. And this is something that we, as Shoshone,
- 15 we protect all those natural resources and also all
- 16 forms of life, not only for ourselves but for people
- 17 that's living around through there close by.
- And people that come there into the areas
- 19 from different places, they want to enjoy the
- 20 environment there in peace and in quiet, and that
- 21 will also be impacted. Because I believe the area
- 22 around through there is mainly used a lot by people
- 23 of that interest. They want some place to go to
- 24 where it's quiet. And it's beginning so that in the
- 25 state of Nevada that those kinds of places are going

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to be heavily impacted by different developers.

2 But this is going to be the major one

3 because it's going to bring in a lot of developing

4 there, a lot of land disturbance. And right now the

5 antelopes that I see that are having babies, they're

6 already impacted by the Highway 95. There's been

7 some roadkills out there. Now, I just wonder, you

8 know, how many is up there in that area where the

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- 9 railway is going to be located.
- 10 So those are our concerns, and they're very
- 11 valid concerns because our practices and our
- 12 traditions have been going on for thousands of years
- 13 that we have protected the land and the whole
- 14 environment, the ecosystem and everything, trying to
- 15 keep it as natural as we possibly can. But we find
- 16 that now with all kinds of developments going on that
- 17 it's almost, you know, we're not even being
- 18 referenced, simply because we're a very small tribe
- 19 and we live very remote. And I believe that's the
- 20 reason why that railway is being brought through
- 21 there because they're saying there's not very many
- 22 people living here. But to us there's a lot of
- 23 living things out there, including us, and this will
- 24 impact.
- 25 Again I will say this will impact our new

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- 1 lands there that we have just acquired from BLM where
- 2 we can do a little economic development there. And
- 3 we've already, you know, studying our water there.
- 4 We have developed a water monitoring wells and to see
- 5 how the water is going through there, how it's
- 6 passing through and the quality of the water and all
- 7 this. And we've already started to do that.
- 8 And so I find it very ironic, you know, that
- 9 we acquired this land right in the midst of the talk
- 10 of the railway corridor that's going to come through
- 11 Sarcobatus Flats or Scottish Juncture, and it is

- 12
- 13 will impact all of Timbisha, all the Shoshone,
- because we all unite and we talk the same way, that 14
- we are here to follow our creator's laws that we are 15
- 16 to protect life.
