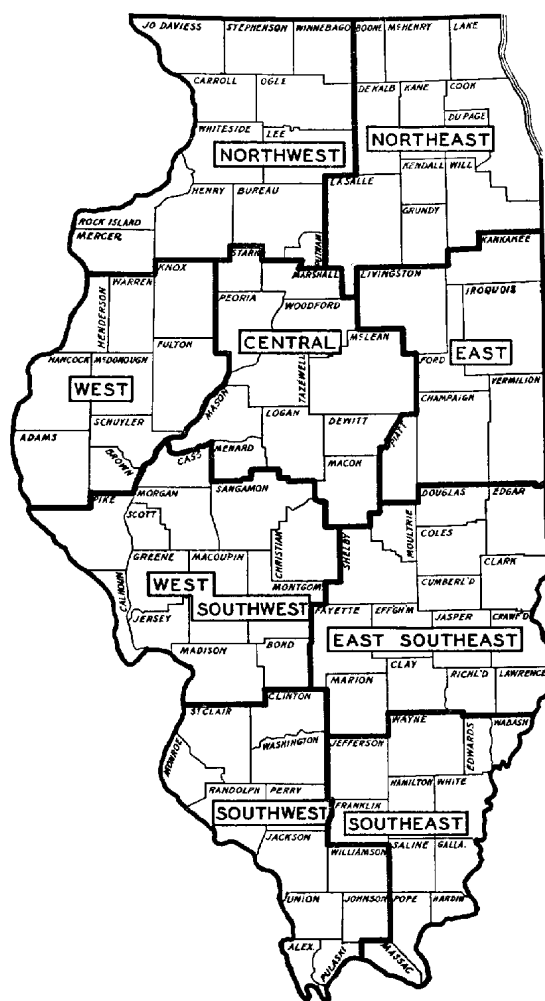

# ILLINOIS ANNUAL CROP SUMMARY 2006

## CORN YIELD UP 20 BUSHEL

Production of corn for grain totaled 1.817 billion bushels in 2006, six percent more than the 2005 production. The final yield was 163 bushels per acre, 20 bushels above the previous year's yield. There were 11.3 million acres planted to corn in Illinois in 2006. After getting off to a slow start, most of the state's corn crop was planted during the last two weeks of April. Hot, humid conditions during the last few weeks of July had the corn crop advancing in maturity at a quick pace. Harvest conditions were generally good across the state during the first half of October before turning cooler and wetter during the latter part of the month, as 11.15 million acres ended up being harvested for grain.

## SECOND HIGHEST YIELD FOR SOYBEANS

The final yield for the 2006 soybean crop was 48.0 bushels per acre, 1.5 bushels above the 2005 yield, but two bushels below the 2004 record high yield. This was the second highest yielding crop on record. Production in 2006 reached 482 million bushels, ten percent above the 2005 production but three percent less than the record production in 2004. This was the second highest production recorded in Illinois. Acres planted in 2006 were up 600 thousand from 2005 to 10.1 million.

Planting got off to a slow start due to cool and wet weather, and did not near completion until early June. The growing season started off dry but turned favorably moist and cooler than normal across most of the state. As harvest began, the weather turned cooler and wetter than normal but delayed harvest only slightly.

## RECORD BREAKING WHEAT YIELD

The final yield for the 2006 winter wheat crop was 67 bushels per acre, up six bushels from last year's yield. This is a new record yield, breaking the previous record by two bushels set in 2003. Acreage seeded in the fall of 2005 was 930 thousand acres, up 300 thousand acres from 2004. Farmers harvested 910 thousand acres for grain this year, up 52 percent from the previous year. This resulted in a total production of 61 million bushels, 67 more than the 2005 production.

## OAT PRODUCTION DOWN

The final oat estimate for 2006 placed the production at 3.08 million bushels, three percent below the 2005 production. Acreage harvested for grain, at 40 thousand, was unchanged from the previous year. The final yield, at 77 bushels per acre, was two bushels below 2005.

**SORGHUM YIELD CONTINUES TO DECREASE**

The final 2006 yield for sorghum for grain was 89 bushels per acre, three bushels below the yield in 2005 and 20 bushels less than 2004. Production, at 6,408 million bushels, was down 16 percent from the previous year. Total planted and harvested for grain acres were 75 and 72 thousand, respectively.

**HAY PRODUCTION UP**

Production of all hay in 2006 was 2.51 million tons, 16 percent more than in 2005. Alfalfa hay production was up 29 percent to 1.80 million tons while all other hay production decreased seven percent to 704 thousand tons. Yields averaged 4.1 tons per acre for alfalfa hay and 2.2 tons per acre for all other hay. Alfalfa acreage cut for hay was 440 thousand in 2006, up ten percent from 2005. Acreage of all other hay cut was 320 thousand, down ten thousand from 2005.

**POTATO NUMBERS ON THE RISE**

Illinois potato producers harvested 6,300 acres in 2006, up from 5,500 acres in 2005. Production increased to 2.49 million cwt. The 2006 potato yield of 395 cwt. per acre was up from the previous year's 380 cwt. per acre

**FRESH MARKET SWEET CORN**

Fresh market sweet corn acreage harvested was up five percent from 2005 to 6,500 acres, but the yield decreased to 71 cwt. per acre, down

from the 2005 yield of 78. Production was down five percent from 2005.

**SNAP BEANS FOR PROCESSING**

Snap bean growers produced 56.6 thousand tons, down 17 percent from 2005. The yield, at 3.82 tons per acre, was down six percent from 2005. Acreage harvested, at 14,800, was down 11 percent from the previous year.

**CABBAGE FOR FRESH MARKET**

Harvested acres remained steady at 750 while production fell to 175,000 cwt. This was a decrease of 26 percent from the previous year's production. The yield was down from 2005 to 233 cwt. per acre.

**PUMPKIN PRODUCTION**

Illinois pumpkin growers harvested 12,700 acres for fresh market and processing, down two percent from the previous year. Production, at 4,918,000 cwt., was one percent below 2005.

**APPLE PRODUCTION**

Illinois apple growers utilized 41.3 million pounds produced in 2006. This was seven percent above the 2005 crop.

**PEACH PRODUCTION**

Illinois utilized peach production during 2006 totaled 10,740 tons. Production was two percent below the 2005 level of 11,000 tons.
