## Family Didelphidae (Opossums and allies)

Opossum (Didelphis virginiana)—Common

# **ORDER INSECTIVORA**

### Family Soricidae (Shrews)

Shorttail Shrew (*Blarina brevicauda*)—Common; **venomous, but not deadly to humans** Least Shrew (*Cryptotis parva*)—Common Desert (Gray) Shrew (*Notiosorex crawfordi*)—Rare

# Family Talpidae (Moles)

Eastern Mole (Scalopus aquaticus)—Common

# **ORDER CHIROPTERA**

#### Family Vespertilionidae (Common Bats)

Cave Myotis (*Myotis velifer*)—Rare Small-footed Myotis (*Myotis leibii*)—Accidental (one specimen recorded) Western Pipistrelle (*Pipistrellus hesperus*)—Common Eastern Pipistrelle (*Pipistrellus subflavus*)—Rare Red Bat (*Lasiurus borealis*)—Occasional Hoary Bat (*Lasiurus cinereus*)—Rare Silver-haired Bat (*Lasionycteris noctivigans*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely Evening Bat (*Nycticeius humeralis*)-- Occurrence in WMWR likely Townsend's (Western) Big-eared Bat (*Plecotus townsendii*)—Abundance?? Rafinesque's Big-eared Bat (*Plecotus rafinesquei*)—Abundance?? Pallid Bat (*Antrozous pallidus*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely

#### Family Molossidae (Free-tailed Bats)

Brazilian (Mexican) Freetail Bat (Tadarida brasiliensis)—Occasional migrations

# Family Dasypodidae (Armadillos)

Nine-banded Armadillo (Dasypus novemcinctus)—Common

### ORDER LAGOMORPHA

#### Family Leporidae (Rabbits and Hares)

Blacktail Jackrabbit (*Lepus californicus*)—Occasional Eastern Cottontail (*Sylvilagus floridanus*)—Common Desert Cottontail (*Sylvilagus audubonii*)—Rare Swamp Rabbit (*Sylvilagus aquaticus*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely

# **ORDER RODENTIA**

### Family Sciuridae (Squirrels and allies)

Blacktail Prairie Dog (*Cynomys ludovicianus*)—Commonly seen (reintroduced) Thirteen-lined Ground Squirrel (*Spermophilus tridecemlineatus*)—Uncommon Spotted Ground Squirrel (*Spermophilus spilosoma*)—Uncommon Eastern Fox Squirrel (*Sciurus niger*)—Abundant Southern Flying Squirrel (*Glaucomys volans*)—Accidental (one specimen recorded)

## Family Geomyidae (Pocket Gophers)

Plains Pocket Gopher (Geomys bursarius)-Occurrence in WMWR likely

### Family Heteromyidae (Kangaroo Rats and Pocket Mice)

Hispid Pocket Mouse (*Chaetodipus hispidus*)—Abundant Ord's Kangaroo Rat (*Dipodomys ordii*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely Texas Kangaroo Rat (*Dipodomys elator*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely

## Family Castoridae (Beavers)

Beaver (Castor canadensis)—Common

# Family Muridae (Mice, Voles and Rats)

Plains Harvest Mouse (*Reithrodontomys montanus*)—Common Fulvous Harvest Mouse (*Reithrodontomys fulvescens*)—Rare Texas Mouse (*Peromyscus attwateri*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely Deer Mouse (*Peromyscus maniculatus*)—Common; **primary carrier of Hantavirus** White-footed Mouse (*Peromyscus leucopus*)—Common Brush Mouse (*Peromyscus boylii*)—Abundant Northern Grasshopper Mouse (*Onychomys leucogaster*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely Hispid Cotton Rat (*Sigmodon hispidus*)—Abundant Southern Plains Woodrat (*Neotoma micropus*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely Eastern Woodrat (*Neotoma floridana*)—Common Woodland (Pine) Vole (*Microtus pinetorum*)—Occasional Norway Rat (*Rattus norvegicus*)—Occasional; exotic species Black Rat (*Rattus rattus*)—Occurrence in WMWR likely; exotic species House Mouse (*Mus musculus*)—Uncommon; exotic species

# Family Erethizontidae (New World Porcupines)

New World Porcupine (Erethizon dorsatum)-Rare

## **ORDER CARNIVORA**

#### Family Ursidae (Bears)

Black Bear (*Ursus americanus*)—Extinct from WMWR Grizzly (*Ursus arctos*)—Extinct from WMWR

#### Family Canidae (Canids)

Coyote (*Canis latrans*)—Common Gray (Timber) Wolf (*Canis lupus*)—Extinct from WMWR Red Wolf (*Canis rufus*)—Extinct from WMWR Red Fox (*Vulpes vulpes*)—Rare; introduced Gray Fox (Urocyon cinereoargenteus)—Uncommon; abundance increasing

#### Family Procyonidae (Raccoons and allies)

Raccoon (*Procyon lotor*)—Abundant Ringtail (*Bassariscus astutus*)—Common

#### Family Mustelidae (Mustelids)

Mink (*Mustela vison*)—Rare River Otter (*Lutra canadensis*)—Occasional; reintroduced in 1990s Badger (*Taxidea taxis*)—Rare

#### Family Mephitidae (Skunks)

Eastern Spotted Skunk (*Spilogale putorius*)—Uncommon Striped Skunk (*Mephitis mephitis*)--Abundant

# Family Felidae (Felids)

Mountain Lion (Cougar) (*Felis concolor*)—Rare Bobcat (*Lynx rufus*)—Common

#### **ORDER ARTIODACTYLA**

# Family Suidae (Pigs)

Feral Pigs (Sus scrofa)—Occasional; exotic species

## Family Cervidae (Deer-Antlered animals)

American Elk (*Cervus elaphus*)—Common; reintroduced Whitetail Deer (*Odocoileus virginianus*)—Common

## Family Bovidae (Horned animals)

Bison (Buffalo) (*Bison bison*)—Common; reintroduced Texas Longhorn Cattle (*Bos taurus*)—Common; exotic species of historical significance Family Antilocapridae (Pronghorn Antelope)

Pronghorn (Antilocapra americana)-Extinct from WMWR; reintroduction unsuccessful
