While walking on the property of Kyle and Nikki Main (15 Calle Cobres) I heard rapid and multiple low intensity gunshot coming from the property of John and Diane Uzakaj (13 Calle Cobres). The wild colt bucked and started to run away. I came out from behind a juniper tree and saw Diane Uzakaj with a large, black pistol-like device shooting at the bay colt. She shouted multiple things to me or seemed very angry, but I did not answer her back. She said that she had me do that because her mares were in heat and some other things which I did not hear clearly. I tried to follow the bay colt to see how badly he was hurt, but he had run off the


To Whom It May Concern:
