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It's the only logical place that we have in
the whole country. We've got the room. There's
nobody there. It's been set aside. We've tested
atomic weaponry there for many years. And besides

1 that, it's right next door to the other government 2 test site up in Dugway, Utah. They tested chemicals, 3 we tested explosives. You knew that, didn't you. 4 I worked at both places. I helped build 5 Dugway and I helped build this one. And we worked 6 there for many years. And we walked around after 7 they exploded bombs, and I don't know of anybody ever 8 in my lifetime that ever died from radiation exposure 9 or had any problems to speak of from radiation 10 exposure or chemical exposure at either one of those pl aces. 11 12 I don't think everybody understands that, but the ones that I met, nobody ever had any 13

problems. We had a lot of people that had a lot of
problems but that was because they drank a lot of
al cohol. They were drunks. But that's the worst I
ever saw.

18 You can put me down as being 120 percent in19 favor of this.

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20 Now, let's put some specs on this so that we 21 can benefit from this. If we're going to be the 22 recipient of this, whatever they call it, vitally, 23 highly, technical, dangerous, whatever, that we ought 24 to be compensated for it as a state. 25 So I would suggest that just off the hat to

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1 arrive at a fair and equitable fee for this that the 2 other 50, how many states do we have now, 50 states, 3 that the other 49 states would be required to 4 contribute to this effort sufficient amounts of money 5 to pay all the expenses of the state of Nevada, the 6 government and running our cities and counties, you 7 It would not include any pay raises for the know. bureaucrats, however. They have to stay where they 8 9 But that way we can quit paying taxes in our are. 10 state.

We can even up the ante maybe a little and get a little extra money to have a party once in a while, I don't know. But at least let's eliminate all the taxes that the people in this state have to pay and let these people that are storing their stuff here pick up the tab is my point. And I think that that would fly. I see nothing wrong with that.

18 They don't want it in New York, they don't 19 want it in Chicago, and they certainly don't want it 20 in L.A., and they don't have a place to put it 21 anyway, as far as I can determine. So where else 22 would they put it if not in either Nevada or the west

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23 desert of Utah? That's about it. The southern part
24 of Idaho or Oregon.
25 But we've got the only place that's feasible

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and plausible and available right away. We've
 already, if you will, contaminated, which I don't
 believe, but we've already exploded a lot of nuclear
 devices right here in your back door yard, my back
 door yard. So I don't see that there's any big
 problem there.

7 So I'm definitely in favor of bringing it 8 on, but whoever brings it on is going to pay. That's 9 my statement. And we can make these people pay 10 sufficient amounts of money that we don't have to pay 11 any more taxes and crap in our state to run it, then 12 I would be more than happy and glad and satisfied. 13 I might add that I have worked at both the 14 Dugway Proving Grounds in Utah and the Nevada Test Site, which are side by side if you look at the map. 15 And I've waded through their chemicals and I've waded 16 17 through their atomic explosions and I've seen a lot 18 of people up there.

We had 10,000 people up here when I worked
up here. And I don't know of any one of them that
ever got sick or died from radiation exposure.
People died but because they had accidents, fell off
the high tower, got drunk, got killed in a car
accident, that kind of stuff. Nobody.
I haven't seen a case documented where

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1 anybody has proven that they got hurt from radiation 2 up there. There's been a lot of claims made I think, 3 but I don't think any of them have been proven. I 4 don't know whether the government has picked any of 5 them up just out of a goodwill gesture or mercy or sympathy or anything else, I don't know. 6 I would 7 imagine that they have in some cases, but I don't 8 think it was legit in my mind that these people got 9 hurt up there from radiation exposure.

10 And so I say, yes, the state of Nevada 11 should get behind this thing, bring it on. We can 12 make them pay us enough money that we won't have to 13 come up with any taxes. We'll be the envy of the 14 whole world, and I'll be richer and so will everybody 15 in this state.

16 We've got a good ride out of it too, by the 17 way. Because people, like I talk to people, they say uh-huh, well, let's see, gambling is all you got down 18 19 That's what made Las Vegas. No, gambling did there. 20 It's been here since 1933 | not make Las Vegas. 21 think legitimately. There's nothing here in gambling 22 when I came here. I came here in 1950, by the way. 23 And it was the Test Site and all the people 24 they hired up there, they had to have a place to 25 live, and hence we started building subdivisions.

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The first subdivisions were built for the people who worked at the Test Site and then we've just gone from there. And I think we've done a pretty good job, I mean taking the bare space out here with nothing and build it.

6 The only thing I'm disappointed in is their 7 water system. They haven't solved that yet for our 8 city, and they could, because we've got all the water 9 we need right out here in the lake. Let's get it 10 fixed and bring some water in.

11 By the way, we need to get rid of the sewer, 12 so let's take care of that going the other way too, 13 back to the lake. We can take care of that in-house. 14 And, you know, that can be had. We need to take care 15 of that.

16 Oh, and we need to make a road in our town, 17 which has nothing to do with this, except if we do 18 any of this stuff, let's see, we've always had to 19 come right through out town to get to the mountain, 20 haven't we? Well, this may or may not be pertinent, 21 but we need to build a bypass around the city, and 22 the easiest place and the best place to build one 23 right now is on the other side of Sunrise Mountain. 24 Get the people from California coming up 25 through, don't have to come in this valley and out,

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coming down going the other way they don't want to
 come to our town, fine, let them go by. We don't
 really need them in here. But that has nothing to do Page 5
