Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

Aminoguandine bicarbonate is used in the synthesis of organic compounds containing nitrogen, such as pharmaceuticals, pesticides, dyes, photographic chemicals, foaming agents and explosives. Its primary applications are in the manufacture of acrylic acid and as a dispersing agent for lubricants. Secondary applications include acting as a stabilizer for polyvinyl chloride (PVC), flame retardants, and textile auxiliaries, and reacting with sodium nitrate to yield tetrazene compounds that are used in the explosives industry. The subject chemical is imported from Germany.
