Contraceptive Technology Update In Kazakhstan Evidence-Based Expert Meeting

Almaty, June 9, 2008 - The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) and its implementing partners - the USAID Europe and Eurasia Regional Activity Program and the USAID ZdravPlus Project in collaboration with the Scientific Center of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Perinatology in Almaty (MCH Center) are holding a meeting "Contraceptive Technology: Evidence-Based Facts."
