HIGHWAY FUNDING 1996 - 1999

Date March 9, 1999

Total disbursements for highways are expected to exceed \$110.2 billion in 1999, an increase of 12.4 percent over 1996, which is the latest year that final numbers are available. Total revenues used for highways or placed in reserves for highways are expected to reach \$115.8 billion in 1999. The difference (\$5.6 billion) will be placed in reserve - \$2.4 billion for the Federal Government and \$3.2 billion for State governments.

In 1999, total highway-user revenues of \$101.3 billion (motor fuel, motor vehicle taxes and fees, and tolls) are anticipated. This would fund about 92 percent of all highway disbursements. However, \$20.0 billion of highway-user revenues are destined for general government use, collection expenses, other non-highway uses, and the Territories, while \$9.0 billion will be used for mass transportation. Consequently, only \$72.3 billion or 71 percent of taxes and fees charged to road users will be applied to the highway programs of Federal, State, and local governments. Since some highway-user revenues will be expended for non-highway purposes, governments at all levels must apply a variety of non-user revenues for highway purposes. Non-user revenue sources include general funds, other specific taxes and fees dedicated to highway purposes, investment income, and bond proceeds.

Total receipts to the Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund (HTF) should total \$33.1 billion in FY 1999, or almost \$10 billion more than 1998. Much of the increase is due to a provision in the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 (TRA), which permitted a delay in payment of certain Highway Trust Fund taxes, which otherwise would have been due in August or September 1998, until October 1998 (Fiscal Year 1999). This "delayed deposit" provision has the effect of understating 1998 and overstating 1999 HTF receipts. Two provisions of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, as amended, (TEA-21) (Public Law 105-178) also affected the HTF. First, at the beginning of FY 1999, as a result of a one-time cash adjustment, the balance in the Highway Account of the HTF was reduced to \$8.0 billion by crediting everything over this amount to the General Fund of the Treasury. Second, beginning with FY 1999, interest on HTF balances will be deposited to the Federal General Fund of the Treasury. Before TEA-21, interest earned was credited to the HTF.

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\$2.7 billion in 1999 (about 5.3 percent over 1998), more significant increases in capital and total outlays may be expected in TEA-21's later years as the Federal funds authorized are paid out in State project expenditures.

Capital expenditures are expected to rise to \$53.5 billion in 1999, accounting for over 48 percent of total highway expenditures. This is an increase of \$6.6 billion, or more than 14 percent compared to 1996. State governments will be responsible for approximately 74 percent of the total, with capital expenditures of \$39.4 billion.

Based upon the latest available data, 31 percent of the State government capital expenditures will be for projects on the Interstate system, and 38 percent will be used on other principal arterials. An additional 21 percent will be for projects on other arterials and collectors, while 10 percent will be used for local roads. Of the amount expended by States on all arterials and collectors, 17 percent is expected to be used for new roads and bridges, 32 percent for other capacity improvements, 43 percent for system preservation, and 8 percent for operational and safety-related improvements.

Total funding for highways including receipts, intergovernmental payments, and disbursements for the years 1996 through 1999 is shown in the attached Table HF-10B.

Projected highway expenditures for 1999 are summarized as follows:
