# SCHOOLS WITH AN ENGLISH SECTION

As in America, children in France are assigned to public school according to where they live. These schools rarely accept students who lack a solid command of French language. Directors may wave this requirement for younger children. Public schools are free to French citizens and residents. Therefore, with a few notable exceptions, this list is slanted toward the private sector. Once students feel comfortable with the French language, they may wish to consider a local public school.

#### **Public (with international section):**

Students begin regular classes at this public school usually after attending an intensive French-as-a-second-language program off-site about 8 blocks away. The college offers an international American section. It prepares students from a variety of countries to function in French at their appropriate grade levels and integrates them into their normal classes at the first opportunity. This highly challenging and quite effective option best suits hard-working, well-motived students.

In the American section program, at the lycee Francois Magendie, students may prepare a Baccalaureat S,ES and L with an international option: Baccalaureat OIB (the "BAC" is a national examination, roughly equivalent in value for universities to both the SAT and Advanced placement tests). True to their international emphasis, the schools offer courses in languages as diverse as Portuguese, Chinese, Russian, Latin and Greek. Courses in American literature, history, and geography (taught by an American) are also available.

BIS takes children from 2 to 5 in Kindergarten, and from 6 to 18 at the primary school and secondary school. Run as a traditional British secondary school, the BIS suits students with little or no knowledge of French who want to continue studying primarily in English. BIS follows the British national curriculum and is generally structured to prepare older students for the British "GCSE" and "A" level exams. It is possible however, for students to prepare for the American SAT, achievement tests, and advanced placement exams on request.

The yearly fees for BIS are approximately \$10,000, but currently; do not exceed the post educational allowance. There is no religion affiliation.

BIS also offers a variety of other part-time and/or summer courses, which might suit a spouse interested in learning French.

Among other French private school in the area, the school is noted for its friendly atmosphere and accommodating teaching staff. It enjoys an excellent academic reputation locally. Recent dependent children have been very pleased with the warm reception and the continued popularity conferred by their American nationality. The teaching staffs and administrators do not seem unduly troubled by the initial start-up difficulties of students adjusting to the French language due to previous experience with children from the consular corps in Bordeaux.

Grand Lebrun is one of the premier schools in the Bordeaux area. Parents interested in this option should apply, as soon as they are assigned.

This institute offers a French-as-foreign-language program during the regular school year. This program is designed for non-native French speakers who want to acquire a good command of the French language and/or to do further French academic studies in the future (foreign students may also sit for French degrees including the French baccalaureat)

This program concerns beginners (First level) or students with an already substantial knowledge of French (Intermediate level). Students make rapid progress since they are immersed in a French environment. The program includes 8 hours of spoken French, 8 hours of written French and 4 hours of French culture (politics, tourism, French history and literature). Foreign students also have the opportunity to take other course such another foreign language, computer science, sport, art...
