Kathy Winters reported
changes to the L-1 forecast

for a Feb. 7 launch of space shuttle Atlantis. The changes include an increase in the probability of Kennedy Space Center weather prohibiting launch to 70 percent, and an increase in the 24- and 48-hour forecast numbers due to the growing potential of a cold front moving into the Central Florida area north of Kennedy, stalling in the area rather than pushing to the south. Primary concerns are cumulus clouds, showers and an anvil from an inland thunderstorm.
