\$750,000

Funds requested are for equipment for an under construction Outpatient Mental Health Clinic in Carroll County, MD. The project will increase mental health services to over 3,600 families annually.

Chesapeake Bay Program Base Budget

\$24,000,000

The program facilitates the coordination of restoration activities conducted by restoration partners toward the Chesapeake 2000 agreement goals. It implies and analyzes monitoring and other data to assess the overall progress of the Bay restoration effort. The increase in funding would support implementation of on-the-ground restoration projects to reduce nutrient and sediment pollution and to improve habitat for the living resources within the Bay watershed.

Chesapeake Bay Program Small Watershed Grants Program

Hagerstown Radio Equipment Acquisition

Hagerstown Solar Sludge Drying Project

This project will use a solar drying technology, supplemented by hot water generated from the combustion of landfill gas to dry municipal waste water treatment filter cake into Class A Bio-solids which can be used to replace coal in cement kilns. This will provide Hagerstown and surrounding communities with a long term, sustainable, cost effective solution to filter cake disposal.

Hagerstown Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Project
