Market Analysis - November 17, 2004

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Last week corn prices were mixed but were left virtually unchanged. The market did have some major news (the USDA report which was bearish) but somehow the market avoided a massive sell off. The new USDA numbers were high at 11.741 billion bushels, 65 million higher than last month. Carryover was therefore raised. Weekly harvest progress was put at 76%. Many analysts think this market is not going anywhere (to those hedgers/part time speculators - start selling straddles and strangles if you think this is true). Short covering on Monday kept the market afloat and even higher. Despite the recent strength farmers are still reluctant to sell so basis is fairly decent nationwide. By the middle of the week most corn activity was linked to soybeans (see below) but for the most part the December contract is trading in a sideways pattern. By midweek harvest reports had the percent up to 86%, which is still 8% off the average pace. On Wednesday corn ended higher after very heavy fund buying and more support from soybeans. The dollar also continues to weaken which will help exports. These are all positive items and what is more, buying interest seems to be picking up for U.S. corn. However, the dollar weakness is becoming an economic worry for some economists (can we expect intervention? I doubt it). Soybeans were the big news item this week with soybean rust being found in the United States. Jan futures closed 20 cents higher as a result. In fact, the rust story made the USDA report seem insignificant, but it should be reported. USDA production came in at 3.15 billion versus a trade guess of 3.14 and carryover was in line with expectations. On Monday there was a lot of short covering and that was based on the rust in the delta region. Some even thought the problem is more widespread than publicized. Sure enough on Tuesday prices soured as more cases were reported and prices followed suit on Wednesday. In the long term perhaps growing acres will be decreased as a result of the possible spread of the fungus (perhaps it is not too early to take a bullish position on November 2005). In the wheat market the USDA did not mean very much at all. Domestic ending stocks were reported at 568 million bushels, slightly above expectations and global stocks were also close to expectations. Monday's rally in wheat was pure and simply tied to the other markets and some technically inspired short covering. Basis firmed in wheat by midweek amid concerns of a lack of quality in the world supply. Wheat ended the week on bullish note - enormous speculative short covering drove prices northwards and this, traders believe, stemmed from the weak dollar and the resulting export business. A great week for the grains in general!

WEEKLY CROP WEATHER SUMMARY

MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS SERVICE

Maryland farmers received from 1 to 2.5 inches of rain last week resulting in 4.6 **days suitable for field work** for the week ending November 14, 2004. **Soybean** harvest continues with 71 percent complete, slightly above last year and the five-year average. **Other hay** 4th cutting and **alfalfa hay** fifth cutting harvest was wrapping up with 89 percent complete for other hay and 59 percent for alfalfa hay. **Pasture** was rated 26 percent excellent, 44 percent good, 24 percent fair, and 6 percent poor. **Hay supplies** was rated 7 percent surplus, 78 percent adequate, 10 percent short and 5 percent very short.
