## Historical Data:

The land upon which this house stands belonged in 1718 to a plantation owned by Dr. Dimsdale which had been resurveyed that year. The plantation contained two thousand one hundred and twenty-two acres. The builder of the tavern was a member of the Haines family, probably Jeremiah. We know that in 1801 the property was given by Benjamin Haines by will to his son William. It remained

in the Haines family until 1864 when Joseph Budd acquired the title. The Budd family held possession until 1913 when J. Aquilla Jones became the owner; that same year, the property was transferred to the present owner.
