## Description:

Two stories and two stories in gable roof; three stories in rear; south end brick, north wood; brick size  $9 \times 5\frac{1}{4} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ ; two arch-hooded doorways; shuttered windows; hand-wrought guard-rails; two tiers dormers in roof; three chimneys, hooded tops. Interior has characteristic sheathed stair rail with scalloped openings between sheathing members.

Kitchen in basement with very large hooded fireplace. This story shows half-timbered construction at north end. The basement has extensive and important masonry vaults.

Now used as women's apartment house.
