Looking for new educational resources but wish you could catch a glimpse of the material before purchasing?

Here at the **National Agricultural Library (NAL)**, you have the opportunity to borrow books, curriculums, audiovisuals, and other resources on a variety of food and nutrition topics. Visit the library online at **http://www.nal.usda.gov**.

There are many ways that you can search for materials in the collection, including a direct search of the Agricultural Online Access database (AGRICOLA).

AGRICOLA is available online at http://www.nal.usda.gov/ag98/.

Another way to find resources in the collection is to search in any of the databases available online at the Food and Nutrition Information Center (FNIC). Just visit http://www.nal.usda.gov /fnic/databases.html and either search all the databases at once, or individually select and search any of the databases listed.

The WIC Works Database is just one of the databases available at FNIC, as you search for resources, the results page will provide you with a link if the material is available online, as well as ordering information and the NAL call number if the item is in the collection.

If you are interested in a particular topic, you can select the "FNIC Resource List" section from the FNIC homepage. Here you will find resources broken out by specific topic. If the resource is in the collection, you will see the NAL call number.

Coming to a Mailbox Near You..

The fall mailing from the WIC Works Resource System will be sent to regional, state, and local WIC agencies in October, providing resources on the important topic of **Substance Abuse**.

In case you are not on this mailing list, here is a guide to substance abuse materials available on the WIC Works web site (http://www.nal.usda.gov/wicworks).

◆ In the Learning Center, you can find Alcohol and Drug Abuse referral information

including links to fact sheets, pamphlets, national contacts, and campaigns.

- ◆ The WIC Works Database contains descriptions and ordering information for videos on fetal alcohol syndrome and the dangers of smoking during pregnancy. There are links to a variety of brochures available online to download or to order in hard copy from the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism.
- ◆ The kit "Providing Drug Abuse Information and Referrals in the WIC Program" from the USDA/

Food and Nutrition Service (FNS), provides insight into WIC's role in preventing drug abuse in pregnant women. The kit contains a guidebook, as well as two companion videos and can be ordered from FNS (while copies are available—email Publications Coordinator at **jackie.rodriguez** @fns.usda.gov) or borrowed from NAL.

◆Finally, the WIC Works Substance Abuse Resource List is now completed and will be available in the mailing as well as online at FNIC (http://www.nal.usda. gov/fnic).
