*An authorization explicitly allows funding for a certain program and / or directs a federal agency to take a certain action. Authorizations express the House's intent to spend, however, actual funding is provided through the annual appropriations process. Authorizations that would result in no significant <u>net</u> cost, net *decreases* or neutrality in mandatory spending, private-sector costs from federal mandates, and tax cuts (or other adjustments in the federal revenue stream) are not included in the totals.

Mandatory spending directly establishes an appropriation. No subsequent action is required for the money to be spent.
