AMENDMENT NUMBER ELEVEN TO THE STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE GRANT AGREEMENT between the Government of the United States of America, acting through the United States Agency for International Development ("USAID"), and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee" or the "IRoA"), acting through the Ministry of Finance, dated as of September, 20, 2007

WHEREAS, the Grantee and USAID entered into a Strategic Objective Grant Agreement ("SOAG") for the Strategic Objective of "A Thriving Economy Led by the Private Sector" (USAID Grant Agreement No. SOAG-306-05-00), dated September 19, 2005 and subsequently amended that SOAG on

- September 30, 2005 (Amendment No. 1);
- April 6, 2006 (Amendment No 2);
- May 11, 2006 (Amendment No 3);
- June 28, 2006 (Amendment No. 4);
- September 18, 2006 (Amendment No. 5);
- September 30, 2006 (Amendment No. 6);
- April 07, 2007 (Amendment No 7),
- July 2, 2007 (Amendment No. 8)
- July 23, 2007 (Amendment No. 9) and,
- September 19, 2007 (Amendment No 10).

The SOAG as so amended is referred to hereinafter as the "Agreement."

WHEREAS, USAID and the Grantee desire to further amend the Agreement to (a) increase the USAID contribution by **Six Hundred Ninety Million Nine Hundred Twenty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Seventeen** United States (U.S.) Dollars **(U.S.** \$690,927,717.00); and (b) update the illustrative financial plan to reflect certain adjustments and to cross reference and cross-walk the original SOAG budget information against the new USAID standardized program budget structure.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto hereby agree that the Agreement shall be amended as follows:

- 1. The first sentence in Section 3.1(a) of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and the following is substituted in lieu thereof: "(a) The Grant. To help achieve the Objective set forth in this Agreement, USAID, pursuant to the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, hereby grants to the Grantee under the terms of this Agreement not to exceed One Billion Eight Hundred Fifty One Million Four Hundred Sixty Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty Nine and Eighty-Two Hundredths United States (U.S.) Dollars (U.S. \$ 1,851,468,829.82) (the 'Grant')."
- 2. The illustrative financial plan set forth in Attachment 1 to Annex 1 to the Agreement is deleted and the updated illustrative financial plan attached hereto as Attachment A and Attachment B to this Amendment is substituted in lieu thereof.

Except as further amended herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect. Capitalized terms not defined in this Amendment shall have the

meanings ascribed thereto in the Agreement This Amendment is prepared in both English and Dari. In the event of ambiguity or conflict between the two versions, the English language version will control.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Grantee and the United States of America, each acting through its duly authorized representatives, have caused this Amendment Number Eleven to be signed in their names and delivered as of the day, month and year first written above.
