CLASSIFICATION:

All age classifications will be determined by the competitor's age as of **May 22, 2005**. There are six age classifications:

55-59 60-64 65-69 70-74 75-79 80+

Competitors will compete by gender in the following events:

Bicycling Bowling Horseshoes Shot Put Swimming Discus

Non-ambulatory competitors will have a separate division in the

following events: Table tennis Swimming
Nine ball Bowling Horseshoes
Shot Put Shuffleboard Discus

Visually impaired competitors will have a separate division in the following events: **Bowling Horseshoes Shuffleboard**

LODGING:

2005 National Veterans Golden Age Games and *Sooner Gold* will be conducted on the University of Oklahoma campus in Norman, Oklahoma. Competitors and coaches will be lodged primarily in Walker Tower Dormitory. Some rooms are also available at the Postal Training Center (PTC) near the campus; however, those rooms will be booked <u>only for overflow/excess capacity</u>. Participants and coaches are encouraged to make reservations at the Walker Tower. Both facilities have limited handicap bathroom access, which will necessitate sharing of handicap bathroom facilities. All lodging facilities are non-smoking. The rates are as follows:

Postal Training Center: Single Occupancy: \$55.00/night

Due to the size of the dorm rooms, single occupancy is recommended – especially for those in wheelchairs or scooters. All lodging costs are the responsibility of the participating competitors, coaches and support staff. All reservations must be made with the Oklahoma City VAMC National Veterans Golden Age Games office at (405) 270-5113 by March 1, 2005. DO NOT CALL THE DORM OR PTC.

^{**}Community bathrooms service 15 rooms

All room reservations are made by completing the registration package.

A valid credit card is REQUIRED to reserve your room.

If you do not have a credit card, please notify your coach.

The deadline for full payment is March 31, 2005.

MEALS:

<u>Breakfast, lunch and dinner</u> will be served at Couch Cafeteria (or specified venues) on OU Campus. Tickets are required for all meals. Meals will be available beginning with dinner on arrival day, Friday, **May 20, 2005** and concluding with breakfast on departure day, Friday, **May 27, 2005**. The menus will accommodate special diets including diabetic, vegetarian, etc. **Other special diet requests are to be in writing and are to accompany the**

registration forms.

Meal tickets will be issued along with keys to the dorm rooms upon arrival. Coaches, support staff and family members may purchase a meal ticket for \$24 per day or \$158.00 for the week.

METHODS OF PAYMENT:

During the registration period of January through March 2005, payment may be by VISA or MasterCard credit cards or by personal check.

Payments may also be made by transferring funds from one VA Fiscal Service to the Fiscal Department at the Oklahoma City VAMC. The funds are to be transmitted via TDA to General Post Fund 8835. Transmitted funds must be received by **May 13, 2005**.

TRAVEL:

The primary airline service is at the Will Rogers International Airport in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma air terminal (OKC).

The Will Rogers Airport is approximately 20 minutes from the OLL.

The Will Rogers Airport is approximately 20 minutes from the OU

Campus.

TRANSPORTATION:

The Games' organizers will provide transportation for arrivals on **Friday**, **May 20, 2005** between the airport and dormitory/PTC. Representatives of the Games will greet you at the airport. Transportation for all National Veterans Golden Age Games sponsored events and activities will also be provided from the dormitory and the Postal Training Center.

Transportation will be provided to the airport for departures on Friday, May 27, 2005.

WEATHER:

Norman's weather in May is usually mild, sunny with occasional storms. The dorm rooms and areas for indoor events are all air-conditioned. Items to consider bringing include a hat, swimsuit, sunscreen, sunglasses, and appropriate clothing for moderate to warm temperatures.

MEDICAL:

Each competitor <u>must</u> complete the enclosed "General Medical Information" forms. In addition to the General Medical Information Form G, a 10-10EZ form <u>must</u> be included with your application.

Medical assistance will be provided 24 hours a day as part of the 2005 National Veterans Golden Age Games and *Sooner Gold*. Sick call and emergency medical treatment will be coordinated at Walker Tower. First aid and patient stabilization will be provided at the events, activities and alternate hotel sites. Ambulances will be called if Emergency Care is needed.

AS A REMINDER, MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IS NOT INTENDED FOR PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS.

Competitors must bring with them enough medication and medical supplies to last throughout the Games. There are no provisions for providing replacement medications and medical supplies.

INSURANCE INFORMATION: It is recommended that you include all of your health insurance papers as

part of your travel papers

CONFIRMATION OF REGISTRATION: Once your completed application has been received and accepted

by the 2005 Games office, a letter of confirmation will be sent to you. Included with the confirmation letter will be a form for you to complete regarding your travel itinerary. The travel itinerary form plus full payment for any meals and alternate activities must be returned by April 15, 2005. All lodging will be reserved with

the credit card provided.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Upon arrival, you will need to check in with the Games representatives at

the dormitory on OU Campus for room registration. Arrival date is Friday,

May 20, 2005. Dinner will be provided followed by entertainment.

Registration for the Games and events will be on Saturday, May 21, from 8AM to 4PM. Opening Ceremonies is at 7:00 pm on Saturday, May 21,

2004.
