


Residential Beds in Philadelphia: FY87-FY97





Inpatient Discharge Before/After First Admission to Shelter - 120 Day Range



Days from First Shelter Admission




Emergency Services Use Before and After First Admission to Shelter - 120 Day Range (Origin represents shelter admission)










The 5 most frequent types of diagnoses given during a hospital stay for homeless-related HHC stays






Comparative Proportions of HHC Hospital Stays Related to Substance Abuse and/or Mental Illness










