A suspension under the Point System is in addition to any other licensing action provided by law and may run concurrently with such other licensing action. The following points are assigned to speed and speed related moving violations: Reckless driving-9 points; exceeding the speed limit by 30 MPH or more-10 points; exceeding the speed limit by 15 to 29 MPH-8 points; exceeding the speed limit by not more than 14 MPH-4 points; negligent driving not involving an accident-3 points; negligent driving involving an accident with property damage-4 points; negligent driving involving an accident with an injury but no property damage-6 points; negligent driving involving an accident with an injury and property damage-8 points; and, driving too slow-2 points.
