Legal Room (200 A/J)

Central intake and triage services are provided by law students from the University of Minnesota, William Mitchell College of Law, Hamline University and the University of St. Thomas Law School, who are volunteering their services through the Minnesota Justice Foundation,

a non-profit organization that pairs law students with lawyer and legal services agencies to help meet the legal needs of low-income and disadvantaged Minnesotans.

Volunteer attorneys are from the Legal Aid Society of Minneapolis, Central Minnesota Legal Services, Faegre & Benson LLP, Volunteer Lawyers Network (a volunteer-based non-profit organization providing free legal civil services to low income persons), the District Court's Self-Help Centers (Family and Civil), and the Hennepin County Public Defender's Office.






