

## **Alcohol-Related Fatalities in 2002**

17,419 people died in 15,626 alcohol-related crashes in 2002.

## 15,626 Alcohol-Related Crashes

- 13,530 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because a driver had a positive BAC.
- 11,581 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because a driver had a BAC of .08 or above.
- 1,626 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because a nonoccupant (pedestrian or bicyclist) had a positive BAC.
- 1,461 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because a nonoccupant (pedestrian or bicyclist) had a BAC of .08 or above.
- 434 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because both a driver and a nonoccupant (pedestrian or bicyclist) had a positive BAC.
- 423 of the total 15,626 crashes were designated as alcohol-related because both a driver and a nonoccupant (pedestrian or bicyclist) had a BAC of .08 or above.
- No crashes were designated alcoholrelated if only a passenger had positive BAC.

Note that the above numbers add to 15,590 rather than 15,626 because the specific roles of participants in 36 alcohol-related crashes could not be identified.

## 17,419 Alcohol-Related Fatalities

- 10,933 of the total 17,419 were drivers. 9,728 of these drivers had positive BAC. 8,571 drivers had a BAC of .08 or above. 1,204 drivers had 0 BAC.
- 3,929 of the total 17,419 were passengers. The BAC level of these passengers is unknown.
- 2,541 of the total 17,419 were nonoccupants (pedestrians or bicyclists). 1,975 nonoccupants had a positive BAC. 1,804 nonoccupants had a BAC of .08 or above. 567 nonoccupants had 0 BAC.
- 16 of the 17,419 were other nonoccupants (occupant of motor vehicle parked by the roadside or in non motor vehicle such as horsedrawn carriage). The BAC level of these other nonoccupants is unknown.
