## MARC 21 655 FIELD AND "GENRE" TERMS FOR MUSIC QUESTIONNAIRE

This questionnaire addresses libraries' use in cataloging of field 655 (Index Term–Genre/Form) of the MARC 21 Format for Bibliographic Data. Some of the questions address libraries' use of that field to provide access to musical compositions using form/genre/type/style terms from the Library of Congress Subject Headings that meet the libraries' criteria for assignment to field 655. Responses will be used in the preparation of a session on the use of genre and form terms for subject access in library catalogs to be given at the February 2006 conference of the Music Library Association (MLA) in Memphis, Tenn. This questionnaire and the conference session itself are jointly sponsored by MLA's Subject Access Subcommittee and Technical Services Round Table. The conference session will include a paper titled "The Use of Form and Genre Terms for Subject Access in the Field of Music" by Geraldine Ostrove, Library of Congress Cataloging Policy and Support Office, who prepared the questionnaire.

Though the session's planners are aware that many libraries use MARC field 655 for "genre" terms from a variety of controlled vocabularies, and that some libraries use the 655 for music terms from LCSH, so far we do not have empirical data to demonstrate the extent and nature of this use for music. While for the MLA session being planned none of the presentations will be for the sole purpose of reporting results of this questionnaire, the responses will provide useful background information and may subsequently lead to publication of new research findings in a currently active area of interest in the field of music librarianship.
