PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Correction to Limited Entry trawl gear fishery management measures North of 40°10' N. lat.

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces a correction to commercial management measures for the Pacific Coast limited entry trawl gear groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and northern California, North of 40°10' N. lat., effective at 0001 hours (local time) October 7, 2008.

This correction to management measures is being implemented in a Federal Register notice that published on October 7, 2008 (73 FR 58499), and is described in this public notice.

Commercial Limited Entry Non-Whiting Trawl Fishery, North of 40°10' N. lat.

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), is included at the end of this public notice.

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

On August 1, 2008 NMFS implemented inseason adjustments to the trip limits in Table 3 (North) for sablefish and Dover sole for vessels using selective flatfish trawl gear. Trip limits for vessels using multiple trawl gears were not changed, creating an inconsistency with the regulations at 50 CFR 660.381(c)(4)(i)(D) and with footnote 8/ of the Table. This correction revises lines 14 and 26 of Table 3 (North) in the Federal Register, to make the multiple trawl gear trip limit values for these species consistent with the definition of multiple bottom trawl gear cumulative trip limits.
