### Summary Statement

An appropriation of \$119.9 million is proposed for Housing for Persons with Disabilities for fiscal year 2006; \$118 million less than enacted for fiscal year 2005 net of rescission. Included in this amount is an estimated \$5 million to renew expiring Project Rental Assistance Contracts (PRAC) under the Housing for Persons with Disabilities program; \$34.4 million for amendments, grant renewals or to provide vouchers to persons with disabilities to find housing in the private market; \$80 million for renewal of the mainstream vouchers; and \$450 thousand for transfer to the Working Capital Fund for information technology in fiscal year 2006.

### Initiatives

The 2006 Budget proposes to terminate grant funding for the new construction of facilities. Funding that remains is targeted to Section 8-type vouchers.

### Proposed Actions

For fiscal year 2006, the Department is proposing \$34.4 million for the Housing for Persons with Disabilities program which was authorized by Section 811 of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act to provide eligible non-profit organizations with capital advances and rental assistance to provide housing for disabled individuals. The \$34.4 million will be used for amendments, grant renewals, or to provide vouchers to persons with disabilities to find housing in the private market. Housing for Persons with Disabilities program is designed to meet the special physical needs of disabled individuals and to accommodate the provision of supportive services.

### Explanation of Indicators

Nearly two million households headed by an elderly individual or a person with a disability receive HUD rental assistance that provides them with the opportunity to afford a decent place to live and often helps them to live independent lives. The Housing for Persons with Disabilities program continues to enable persons with disabilities to live in mainstream environments. These indicators will measure the success of this program by examining whether service-enriched housing increases the satisfaction of persons with disabilities with their units, developments, and neighborhoods.

For capital advance contracts, including amendments to capital advance contracts, for supportive housing for persons with disabilities, as authorized by section 811 of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act, for project rental assistance for supportive housing for persons with disabilities under section 811(d)(2) of such Act, including amendments to contracts for such assistance and renewal of expiring contracts for such assistance for up to a 1-year term, and for supportive services associated with the housing for persons with disabilities as authorized by section 811(b)(1) of such Act, and for tenant-based rental assistance contracts entered into pursuant to section 811 of such Act, [\$250,570,000] \$119,900,000 to remain available until expended: Provided, That \$450,000 shall be transferred to the Working Capital Fund: Provided further, That of the amount provided under this heading [\$28,890,000,000 shall be for amendments {to existing} or renewal of tenant-based assistance contracts {entered into prior to fiscal year 2004 (only one amendment authorized for any such contract)]: Provided further, That of the amount provided under this heading, \$5,000,000 may be made available for the renewal of project rental assistance contracts: [the Secretary may make available up to \$10,000,000 for incremental tenant-based rental assistance, as authorized by section 811 of such Act (which assistance is 5 yeas in duration:) Provided further, That all tenant-based assistance made available under this heading shall continue to remain available only to persons with disabilities: Provided further, That the Secretary may waive the provisions of section 811 governing the terms and conditions of project rental assistance and tenant-based assistance, except that the initial contract term for such assistance shall not exceed five years in duration.

[Title II of the Department of Veterans Affairs and Housing and Urban Development, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act, 2004, is amended under this heading by striking the fourth proviso and inserting "Provided further, That all section 811 balances outstanding, as of September 30, 2003, shall be transferred to the appropriation under this heading."] Provided further, That amounts made available under this heading shall be available for Real Estate Assessment Center inspections and inspection related activities associated with section 811 capital advance projects.
