

Inside Story


The National Park Service is committed to the use of clean, renewable energy practices throughout the park. Renewable energy is the term used to describe power that comes from sources that are easily replaced and limitless. Each minute, enough sunlight reaches the Earth's surface to meet the world's energy demand for an entire year.

At the *Satwiwa Native American Indian Culture Center*, we are steadfast toward walking lightly on Mother Earth. On the roof you will notice solar panels. These panels directly convert solar energy to electrical energy. The panels are 310 square feet in area. They generate around 6,000 kwh per year – what a typical California single family residence consumes annually. The power generated fully meets, and in fact slightly exceeds, the amount of electricity needed to run this building.



The chart above shows that, on a clear day, the power generated increases as the sun rises in the sky and peaks at noon when the sun's rays are most direct on the panels. During a cloudy day, the power generation may be reduced by more then half but power continues to be generated.

The SAMObile is a natural gas/petroleum bi-fuel vehicle. Its fuel sources, however, are only half the story. It is a traveling invitation for visitors to follow its tracks and discover the fascinating stories and interesting places that make this park worth visiting and protecting.



Exterior graphics including a mountain lion "hanging out" in the back seat, a backdrop of the Santa Monica Mountains, and two friendly rangers are only a few hints of what's "HEADed your way."

Stored within the van are interactive exhibits that are portable and easy to assemble for community events and trailhead activities. Each exhibit piece reflects the fun slogans on the exterior. *"HEADed your way"* is a mountain lion and your roll of the ball determines its fate. *"FEETS of Nature"* explores amazing plant and animal feats from the "big" feats to the hidden feats beneath our feet. The *"TAILgate Party"* is a wheel of fortune, revealing how nature

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can teach us useful ways to interact with our environment, share our natural world, and plan for our future.

A team of six interpretive park rangers at Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area brainstormed design concepts and then built and tested prototypes. 

HIKING & SAFETY TIPS

Ticks are plentiful. Some of them carry diseases. Check your clothing and exposed skin after hiking.

Southern Pacific Rattlesnakes

make the mountains their home. Stay away from them, and they won't bother you. In case of a rattlesnake bite, DO NOT make an incision or try to draw out venom. Splint the extremity and transport victim to an emergency room.

Wear sturdy **footwear**-hiking boots or sneakers with good tread.

Poison oak can be identified by its clusters of three shiny leaflets. The best way to avoid it is to stay on trails. **Never hike alone**, use the buddy system. That leaves someone to go for help if you encounter trouble.

Help prevent wildfire. Do not smoke on trails or in brush areas. Do not build fires on the ground.

Carry plenty of **water** and drink it. One quart for short walks, more for longer hikes.

Note: Whether you are an equestrian, hiker, or mountain bicyclist, please help us protect our natural areas by staying on designated trails. Be considerate of other trail users and respect private land.
