

Education Programs

Moovelous Milk Grades: Pre-k to 3rd Monday, 10:00 a.m. October through May 25 students or less This is an educational program that introduces the student to the importance of dairy products. Assist the Park Ranger in milking the cow and learn how to churn milk to butter.

Animal Life on the Farm

Grades: Pre-k to 1st Tuesday, 10:00 a.m. October through May 25 students or less Students will learn about farm animals, food products, and farm life. Students will meet the dairy cow, feed the chickens, and take a wagon ride through the barnyard areas. This program includes a loan of an educational kit to be used in the classroom prior to the visit.

Exploring the Past at Oxon Cove Park

Grades: Kindergarten to 6th Wednesday, 10:00 a.m. October through May 25 students or less Students will discover what life was like on the Mount Welby plantation during the early 1800s. Teachers can choose from 14 activities based on the themes of immigration, slavery, the Underground Railroad, and the war of 1812. Completion of pre-site and post-site

activities is required. Costumed characters and a wagon ride make this field trip fun, as well as, educational.
