IROQUOIS NWR TO HOST A SPECIAL YOUTH TURKEY HUNTING DAY

Iroquois National Wildlife Refuge in Alabama, NY announced today that will host a Youth Turkey Hunt Program on the first Sunday of the spring turkey hunting season, May 4. Any licensed junior hunter between the ages of 12 - 17 years may apply.

The program is free, however; space is limited. To participate, send a letter or post card with your name, address, telephone number and age to: Iroquois National Wildlife Refuge, 1101 Casey Road, Basom, NY 14013 or call (585) 948-5445 on Monday - Friday between 7:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. or weekends 9 am – 5 pm beginning March 22. All junior hunters must be accompanied by a licensed adult on both Saturday and Sunday, although the adult may not hunt on Sunday. To receive a permit, junior hunters must first attend a mandatory orientation on Saturday, May 3, 2 pm – 4 pm at the refuge office. Permits will be issued upon completion of the orientation. The deadline to register is April 19. Those selected will be notified by mail.
