AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 28-646, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO TRAFFIC SIGNS,  
SIGNALS AND MARKINGS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 28-646, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 28-646. Pedestrian control signals; loitering prohibited

5 A. If special pedestrian control signals exhibiting the words "walk"  
6 or "don't walk" OR A SYMBOL OF A WALKING PERSON THAT SYMBOLIZES THE WORD  
7 "WALK" OR A SYMBOL OF AN UPRAISED HAND THAT SYMBOLIZES THE WORDS "DON'T WALK"  
8 are in place, the signals shall indicate as follows:

9 1. Walk OR A SYMBOL OF A WALKING PERSON. Pedestrians facing the  
10 signal may proceed across the roadway in the direction of the signal and  
11 shall be given the right-of-way by the drivers of vehicles.

12 2. Don't walk OR A SYMBOL OF AN UPRAISED HAND. A pedestrian shall not  
13 start to cross the roadway in the direction of the signal, but a pedestrian  
14 who has partially completed crossing on the walk signal shall proceed to a  
15 sidewalk or safety island while the don't walk signal is showing.

16 B. A pedestrian shall not loiter or unduly delay crossing the roadway  
17 after traffic has stopped to give the right-of-way.
