AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE STATE PARKS FINANCING STUDY COMMITTEE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. State parks financing study committee: membership:
3 duties; report

4 A. The state parks financing study committee is established consisting
5 of the following members:

6 1. Three members of the house of representatives who are appointed by
7 the speaker of the house of representatives, not more than two of whom are
8 members of the same political party. The speaker of the house of
9 representatives shall designate one of these members to serve as
10 cochairperson of the committee.

11 2. Three members of the senate who are appointed by the president of
12 the senate, not more than two of whom are members of the same political
13 party. The president of the senate shall designate one of these members to
14 serve as cochairperson of the committee.

15 3. Three members who are appointed by the governor and who have an
16 interest in natural, cultural or recreational resources in this state.

17 B. Members of the study committee are not eligible to receive
18 compensation.

19 C. The study committee may use the services of legislative staff as
20 required.

21 D. The study committee shall:

22 1. Study and make recommendations on the financing of the Arizona
23 state park system, including the capital development, maintenance and
24 operating needs of the system.

25 2. On or before December 31, 2008, submit a report regarding its
26 findings and recommendations to the governor, the speaker of the house of
27 representatives, the president of the senate and the Arizona state parks
28 board and provide a copy of the report to the secretary of state and the
29 director of the Arizona state library, archives and public records.

30 Sec. 2. Delayed repeal

31 This act is repealed from and after September 30, 2009.
