I recently viewed a news broadcast regarding the possibility of legislation the FTC is considering that would enable the Consumer to remove his/her name from telemarketing lists **thus** eliminating the **incitating** and relentless marketing calls that come into our homes almost on a daily basis.

I have actually stopped answering my telephone **at** all because these calls are getting so obtrusive! I do know when a marketer calls because when my answering machine begins to answer the call, I get a hang up. I have gotten upwards of four to five calls in an evening and even on the weekends. There is no time that is sacred to these marketing Companies and while I do feel some compassion for the telemarketer who is trying to make a living, I **am** not likely to purchase ANYTHING over the telephone!

If there is any possibility of legislation that will curb this activity, I am all for it. Please add my letter to your list of consumers who would be very willing to add their name to a "do not call" registry.



Re: a national telemarketing do-not-call-list






