

## CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE COST ESTIMATE

## H.R. 1157 Breast Cancer and Environmental Research Act of 2008

As ordered reported by the Committee on Energy and Commerce on September 23, 2008

H.R. 1157 would establish an interagency committee to coordinate federal research related to breast cancer and advise the National Institutes of Health (NIH) on improving research in this field. The bill also would authorize the appropriation of an additional \$40 million a year for fiscal years 2009 through 2012 to carry out research activities under title IV of the Public Health Service Act.

Based on historical spending patterns for NIH, and assuming appropriation of the authorized amounts, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 1157 would cost \$10 million in 2009 and \$148 million over the 2009-2013 period. Enacting the bill would have no effect on direct spending or revenues. The costs of this legislation fall within budget function 550 (health).
