AMENDING SECTION 15-1626, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-1626, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-1626. General administrative powers and duties of board 5 Α. The board shall: 6 1. Have and exercise the powers necessary for the effective governance 7 and administration of the institutions under its control. To that end, the board may adopt, and authorize each university to adopt, such regulations, 8 9 policies, rules or measures as are deemed necessary and may delegate in writing to its committees, to its university presidents, or their designees, 10 11 or to other entities under its control, any part of its authority for the 12 administration and governance of such institutions, including those powers 13 enumerated in section 15-1625, subsection B, paragraphs 2 and 4, paragraphs 14 3, 4, 8, 9, 11 and 12 of this subsection and subsection B of this 15 section. Any delegation of authority may be rescinded by the board at any 16 time in whole or in part. 17 2. Appoint and employ and determine the compensation of presidents 18 with such power and authority and for such purposes in connection with the 19 operation of the institutions as the board deems necessary. 20 and determine 3. Appoint employ and the compensation of 21 vice-presidents, deans, professors, instructors, lecturers, fellows and such 22 other officers and employees with such power and authority and for such 23 purposes in connection with the operation of the institutions as the board 24 deems necessary, or delegate its authority pursuant to paragraph 1 of this 25 subsection. 26 4. Remove any officer or employee when the interests of education in 27 this state so require in accordance with its personnel rules and policies. 28 5. Fix tuitions and fees to be charged and differentiate the tuitions 29 fees between institutions and between residents, nonresidents, and 30 undergraduate students, graduate students, students from foreign countries 31 and students who have earned credit hours in excess of the credit hour 32 threshold. For the purposes of this paragraph, the undergraduate credit hour 33 threshold is one hundred fifty-five hours for students who attend a 34 university under the jurisdiction of the board in fiscal year 2006-2007, one 35 hundred fifty hours for students who attend a university under the 36 jurisdiction of the board in fiscal year 2007-2008 and one hundred forty-five 37 hours for students who attend a university under the jurisdiction of the 38 board after fiscal year 2007-2008. The undergraduate credit hour threshold 39 shall be based on the actual full-time equivalent student enrollment counted 40 on the twenty-first day after classes begin for the fall semester of 2005 and 41 every fall semester thereafter and any budget adjustment based on student 42 enrollment shall occur in the fiscal year following the actual full-time 43 equivalent student enrollment count. The undergraduate credit hour threshold 44 shall not apply to degree programs that require credit hours above the credit 45 hour threshold, credits earned in the pursuit of up to two baccalaureate

1 degrees, credits earned in the pursuit of up to two state regulated 2 licensures or certificates, credits earned in the pursuit of teaching 3 certification, credits transferred from a private institution of higher 4 education, credits transferred from an institution of higher education in 5 another state. credits earned at another institution of higher education but 6 that are not accepted as transfer credits at the university where the student 7 is currently enrolled and credits earned by students who enroll at a 8 university under the jurisdiction of the board more than twenty-four months 9 after the end of that student's previous enrollment at a public institution of higher education in this state. On or before October 15 of each year, the 10 11 board shall report to the joint legislative budget committee the number of 12 students who were enrolled at universities under the jurisdiction of the 13 board during the previous fiscal year who met or exceeded the undergraduate 14 credit hour threshold prescribed in this paragraph. The amount of tuition, 15 registration fees and other revenues included in the operating budget for the 16 university adopted by the board as prescribed in paragraph 13 of this 17 subsection shall be deposited, pursuant to sections 35-146 and 35-147. All 18 other tuition and fee revenue shall be retained by each university for 19 expenditure as approved by the board, except that the universities shall not 20 use any tuition or fee revenue to fund or support an alumni association.

Except as provided in subsection H of this section, adopt rules to
 govern its tuition and fee setting process that provide for the following:

23 (a) At least one public hearing at each university as an opportunity 24 for students and members of the public to comment upon ON any proposed 25 increase in tuition or fees.

(b) Publication of the notice of public hearing at least ten days
 prior to BEFORE the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in Maricopa
 county, Coconino county and Pima county. The notice shall include the date,
 time and location of the public hearing.

30 (c) Public disclosure by each university of any proposed increases in
 31 tuition or fees at least ten days prior to BEFORE the public hearing.

32 (d) Final board action on changes in tuition or fees shall be taken by 33 roll call vote.

(e) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBDIVISION (f) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE BOARD
MAY ADJUST TUITION FOR EXISTING STUDENTS ONLY BY THE CHANGE IN THE HIGHER
EDUCATION PRICE INDEX FROM THE SECOND PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR TO THE CALENDAR
YEAR IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE CURRENT YEAR. ALL TUITION ADJUSTMENTS SHALL
TAKE EFFECT IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR FOLLOWING THE CHANGE.

39 (f) THE BOARD MAY MAKE TUITION ADJUSTMENTS THAT APPLY ONLY TO THE 40 FOLLOWING:

41 42 (i) NONRESIDENT STUDENTS.

(ii) NEWLY ENROLLED STUDENTS.

43 (iii) EXISTING STUDENTS WHO SUBSEQUENTLY QUALIFY FOR INCLUSION IN A
 44 DIFFERENT TUITION CATEGORY PRESCRIBED IN THIS PARAGRAPH.

1 (iv) EXISTING STUDENTS WHO ABANDON A PREVIOUSLY DECLARED PROGRAM OF 2 STUDY.

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(v) EXISTING STUDENTS WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FULL-TIME FOR SIX YEARS OR MORE.

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(vi) DIFFERENT CAMPUSES WITHIN THE SAME UNIVERSITY.

6 The procedural requirements of subdivisions (a), (b), (c), and (d), (e) AND 7 (f) apply only to those changes in tuition or fees that require board 8 approval.

9 7. Pursuant to section 35-115, submit a budget request for each 10 institution under its jurisdiction that includes the estimated tuition and 11 fee revenue available to support the programs of the institution as described 12 in the budget request. The estimated available tuition and fee revenue shall 13 be based on the tuition and registration fee rates in effect at the time the 14 budget request is submitted with adjustments for projected changes in 15 enrollment as provided by the board.

16 8. Establish curriculums and designate courses at the several 17 institutions which in its judgment will best serve the interests of this 18 state.

Award such degrees and diplomas upon ON the completion of such
 courses and curriculum requirements as it deems appropriate.

21 10. Prescribe qualifications for admission of all students to the 22 universities. The board shall establish policies for guaranteed admission 23 that assure fair and equitable access to students in this state from public, 24 private, charter and home schools. For the purpose of determining the 25 qualifications of honorably discharged veterans, veterans are those persons 26 who served in the armed forces for a minimum of two years and who were 27 previously enrolled at a university or community college in this state. No 28 prior failing grades received by the veteran at the university or community 29 college in this state may be considered.

Adopt any energy conservation standards promulgated ADOPTED by the
 department of administration for the construction of new buildings.

12. Employ for such time and purposes as the board requires attorneys whose compensation shall be fixed and paid by the board. Litigation to which the board is a party and for which self-insurance is not provided may be compromised or settled at the direction of the board.

36 13. Adopt annually an operating budget for each university equal to the 37 sum of appropriated general fund monies and the amount of tuition, 38 registration fees and other revenues approved by the board and allocated to 39 each university operating budget.

40 14. In consultation with the state board of education and other 41 education groups, develop and implement a program to award honors 42 endorsements to be affixed to the high school diplomas of qualifying high 43 school pupils and to be included in the transcripts of pupils who are awarded 44 endorsements. The board shall develop application procedures and testing 45 criteria and adopt testing instruments and procedures to administer the program. In order to receive an honors endorsement, a pupil must demonstrate an extraordinary level of knowledge, skill and competency as measured by the testing instruments adopted by the board in mathematics, English, science and social studies. Additional subjects may be added at the determination of the board. The program is voluntary for pupils.

6 15. Require the publisher of each literary and nonliterary textbook 7 used in the universities of this state to furnish computer software in a 8 standardized format when software becomes available for nonliterary 9 textbooks, to the Arizona board of regents from which braille versions of the 10 textbooks may be produced.

16. Require universities that provide a degree in education to require 12 courses that are necessary to obtain a provisional structured English 13 immersion endorsement as prescribed by the state board of education.

14 17. Beginning July 1, 2007, purchase ACQUIRE United States flags for 15 each classroom that are manufactured in the United States and that are at 16 least two feet by three feet and hardware to appropriately display the United 17 States flag and purchase FLAGS, ACQUIRE a legible copy of the Constitution of 18 the United States and the Bill of Rights, and display the flags in each 19 classroom in accordance with title 4 of the United States Code and display a 20 legible copy of the Constitution of the United States and the bill of rights 21 adjacent to the flag.

18. To facilitate the transfer of military personnel and their dependents to and from the public schools of this state, pursue, in cooperation with the state board of education, reciprocity agreements with other states concerning the transfer credits for military personnel and their dependents. A reciprocity agreement entered into pursuant to this paragraph shall:

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(a) Address procedures for each of the following:

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(i) The transfer of student records.(ii) Awarding credit for completed course work.

(ii) Awarding credit for completed course work.
 (iii) Permitting a student to satisfy the graduation requirements
 prescribed in section 15-701.01 through the successful performance on
 comparable exit-level assessment instruments administered in another state.

(b) Include appropriate criteria developed by the state board of
 education and the Arizona board of regents.

36 B. The board shall adopt personnel rules. All nonacademic employees 37 of the universities are subject to these rules except for university 38 presidents, university vice-presidents, university deans, legal counsel and 39 administrative officers. The personnel rules shall be similar to the 40 personnel rules under section 41-783. The rules shall include provisions for 41 listing available positions with the department of economic security, 42 competitive employment processes for applicants, probationary status for new 43 nonacademic employees, nonprobationary status on successful completion of 44 probation and due process protections of nonprobationary employees after

discharge. The board shall provide notice of proposed rule adoption and an
 opportunity for public comment on all personnel rules proposed for adoption.

C. The board may employ legal assistance in procuring loans for the institutions from the United States government. Fees or compensation paid for such legal assistance shall not be a claim upon the general fund of this state but shall be paid from funds of the institutions.

D. The board shall approve or disapprove any contract or agreement entered into by the university of Arizona hospital with the Arizona health facilities authority.

E. The board may adopt policies which authorize the institutions under its jurisdiction to enter into employment contracts with nontenured employees for periods of more than one year but not more than five years. The policies shall prescribe limitations on the authority of the institutions to enter into employment contracts for periods of more than one year but not more than five years, including the requirement that the board approve the contracts.

16 F. The board may adopt a plan or plans for employee benefits which 17 allow for participation in a cafeteria plan that meets the requirements of 18 the United States internal revenue code of 1986.

19 G. The board may establish a program for the exchange of students 20 between the universities under the jurisdiction of the board and colleges and 21 universities located in the state of Sonora, Mexico. Notwithstanding subsection A, paragraph 5 of this section, the program may provide for 22 23 in-state tuition at the universities under the jurisdiction of the board for 24 fifty Sonoran students in exchange for similar tuition provisions for up to 25 fifty Arizona students enrolled or seeking enrollment in Sonoran colleges or 26 universities. The board may direct the universities to work in conjunction 27 with the Arizona-Mexico commission to coordinate recruitment and admissions 28 activities.

H. Subsection A, paragraph 6, subdivisions (a), (b), (c), and (d), (e) AND (f) of this section do not apply to fee increases that are set by individual universities and that do not require approval by the Arizona board of regents before the fee increase becomes effective.

34 Section 15–1626, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by this act, 35 applies beginning with the 2007–2008 academic year.
