ORDER

By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. The Telecommunications Access Policy Division has under consideration a Waiver Request from Central City Public Library (Central City), Central City, Nebraska.¹ Central City seeks a waiver of the Commission's rules governing discounts for services under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism.² Specifically, Central City requests a waiver of the filing deadline for Funding Year 4.³ For the reasons set forth below, we deny Central City's Waiver Request.

2. Under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism, eligible schools, libraries, and consortia that include eligible schools and libraries, may apply for discounts for eligible telecommunications services, Internet access, and internal connections.⁴ In order to receive discounts on eligible services, the Commission's rules require that the applicant submit to the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Administrator a completed FCC Form 470, in which the applicant sets forth its technological needs and the services for which it seeks discounts.⁵ Once the applicant has complied with the Commission's competitive bidding

requirements and entered into agreements for eligible services, the applicant must submit a completed FCC Form 471 application to the Administrator.⁶

3. The Commission's rules require the Administrator to implement an initial filing period ("filing window") for FCC Form 471 applications that treats all schools and libraries filing within that period as if their applications were simultaneously received.⁷ Applications that are received outside of this filing window are subject to separate funding priorities under the Commission's rules.⁸ It is to all applicants' advantage, therefore, to ensure that the Administrator receives their applications prior to the close of the filing window. In Funding Year 4, the window closed on January 18, 2001.⁹

4. Central City admits that it was late in submitting its FCC Form 471, but attributes the delay to technological problems and staff error.¹⁰ Central City electronically filed its FCC Form 470 on December 14, 2000, well before the filing window closed.¹¹ However, Central City electronically submitted its FCC Form 471, and mailed the associated Block 6 certification and Item 21 attachments five days after the filing window closed, on January 23, 2001.¹² Central City requests a waiver of the deadline from the Commission, as SLD can not give a waiver of the Commission's rules.¹³

5. Central City's Waiver Request can be granted only if waiving the deadline is supported by a showing of good cause.¹⁴ A deviation from a general rule is not permitted unless special circumstances warrant it and the deviation would better serve the public interest than strict adherence to the general rule.¹⁵ SLD reviews and processes thousands of applications each year, and therefore it is administratively necessary to place on the applicant responsibility for complying with our rules and procedures.¹⁶ Timely submissions are needed because, under the funding mechanism, all requests for funding received within the initial filing deadline must be

analyzed together in order to be considered pursuant to the funding priorities for in-window applicants.¹⁷

6. In support of its Waiver Request, Central City offers several reasons for the delay, and notes the need for universal service discounts. Central City asserts that due to the unexpected failure of its broadband access, its Internet access was cut off for a period of time in January and therefore the library could not download the FCC Form 471. The delay was attributed to storm damage and the service provider's failure to make repairs.¹⁸ In further support of its Waiver Request, Central City also notes that its director was new and busy with other work, and the library is small and well-used.¹⁹

7. We have traditionally held applicants to a high standard for waivers, noting that ultimately it is the applicant who has responsibility for the timely submission of its application. The applicant ultimately bears the responsibility of completing the relevant forms and submitting them within the established deadline if the applicant wishes to be considered with other inwindow applicants.²⁰ We have consistently held that misunderstanding does not relieve applicants of their responsibility to understand and comply with the program's rules and procedures.²¹ We note that information about applications could be obtained through SLD's toll free number and e-mail, as noted in the instructions for the FCC Form 471 for Funding Years 1, 2 and 3.²² Applicants are expected to anticipate the possibility of delays, including those attributable to bad weather.²³ Therefore, we do not find that special circumstances exist for purposes of the waiver based on Central City's claim that it lost broadband access for a period of

time. Nor can we waive the rules based on the claim that the person tasked with filing the FCC Form 471 was recently hired and over-burdened with work. Furthermore, we have held that the assertion that a denial of an application may have a detrimental impact on schools and libraries does not create the special circumstances that warrant waiver of the Commission's rules.²⁴ Therefore, we cannot give a waiver based on the premise that the library is small and well-used. We conclude that Central City has not demonstrated special circumstances upon which its Waiver Request can be granted.

8. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to authority delegated under sections 0.91, 0.291, 1.3, and 54.722(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, 1.3, and 54.722(a), that the Waiver Request filed by Central City Public Library, Central City, Nebraska, on December 28, 2001, IS DENIED.
