# **SB 1231**

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMITTEE ON GLOBAL POSITION SYSTEM  
MONITORING.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Joint legislative study committee on global position  
3 system monitoring; report

4 A. The joint legislative study committee on global position system  
5 monitoring is established consisting of the following members:

6 1. Two members of the senate who are appointed by the president of the  
7 senate and who are members of different political parties.

8 2. Two members of the house of representatives who are appointed by  
9 the speaker of the house of representatives and who are members of different  
10 political parties.

11 3. Two judges, one of whom is from a county with a population of five  
12 hundred thousand persons or more and one of whom is from a county with a  
13 population of less than five hundred thousand persons, who are appointed by  
14 the chief justice of the supreme court.

15 4. Two probation officers, one of whom is from a county with a  
16 population of five hundred thousand persons or more and one of whom is from a  
17 county with a population of less than five hundred thousand persons, who are  
18 appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court.

19 5. Two victims' advocates, one of whom is appointed by the president  
20 of the senate and one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the house of  
21 representatives.

22 6. The director of the state department of corrections or the  
23 director's designee.

24 7. One representative of the administrative office of the courts who  
25 has experience with the provision of probation services and who is appointed  
26 by the chief justice of the supreme court.

27 8. One chief of police or county sheriff who is appointed by the  
28 president of the senate.

29 B. The committee shall review issues relating to:

30 1. The implementation of global position system monitoring as required  
31 by sections 13-902 and 41-1604.08.

32 2. The use of active global position system monitoring compared to the  
33 use of passive global position system monitoring and the costs associated  
34 with both systems.

35 3. The types of crimes for which active or passive global position  
36 system monitoring should be required.

37 4. The use of active and passive global position system monitoring in  
38 other states.

39 5. The appropriate staffing levels to administer active or passive  
40 global position system monitoring.

41 6. The role of a law enforcement agency in monitoring active or  
42 passive global position system monitoring.

43 C. The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of  
44 representatives shall each select a cochairman of the committee.

1           D. The committee shall submit a written report regarding the  
2 committee's activities and recommendations on or before December 1, 2008 to  
3 the governor, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of  
4 representatives, and provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state  
5 and the director of the Arizona state library, archives and public records.

6           Sec. 2. Delayed repeal

7           This act is repealed from and after September 30, 2009.
